



# Manitoba Employment Up by 5,100, Labour Force Up by 4,200

Employment rate (%)

From August 2024 to September 2024, the Manitoba labour force increased by 4,200 persons (+0.6%). Canada's labour force increased by 15,900 (+0.1%). Compared to the previous September, the labour force increased by 3.1% in Manitoba.

Manitoba's employment level increased by 5,100 (+0.7%) in September compared to August. This follows an increase of 4,400 positions in the previous month.

Employment growth varied across the country, with Manitoba ranking first among the provinces. Prince Edward Island recorded the second largest gain in employment (+0.6%), while New

Brunswick recorded the largest decrease (-1.0%). Canada's employment over the one-month period increased by 46,700 persons, or 0.2%.

From September 2023 to September 2024, Manitoba's employment increased by 18,500 persons, or 2.6%.

Private sector jobs in Manitoba increased by 3,100 (+0.7%) from August to September, while public sector jobs increased by 1,800 (+1.0%). The number of self-employed jobs increased by 200 (+0.3%) over the one-month period.

Full-time employment increased by 5,300 positions (+0.9%) from August to September, while part-time employment decreased by 200 positions (-0.1%).




### **Manitoba Unemployment Rate Drops to 5.7%**

Manitoba's unemployment rate was 5.7% for September 2024, down 0.1 percentage points from the previous month and below Canada's rate of 6.5%.

Manitoba recorded the second lowest unemployment rate among the provinces, tied with Saskatchewan. Quebec recorded the lowest unemployment rate at 5.5%, while Newfoundland and Labrador recorded the highest rate at 10.0%. Compared to September last year, Manitoba's unemployment rate increased by 0.5 percentage points.

The province's youth (aged 15 to 24 years) unemployment rate was 10.6% in September, down 0.8 percentage points from the previous month. Canada's youth unemployment rate for September 2024 was 13.5%, a decrease of 1.0 percentage points compared to the previous month. Compared to September 2023, the youth unemployment rate in Manitoba is up 0.1 percentage points.



## Female Employment Up by 4,600, Male Employment Up by 500


In Manitoba, female employment increased by 4,600 jobs (+1.4%) in September compared to August, with an increase in full-time jobs (+5,500; +2.2%) and a decrease in part-time jobs (-900; -1.0%). Nationally, female employment rose by 0.3%. Male employment in Manitoba increased by 500 (+0.1%) from August to September, with full-time jobs declining by 300 (-0.1%) and part-time jobs increasing by 700 (+1.4%). Nationally, male employment grew by 0.1%. Compared to the previous year, employment in Manitoba increased for both females (+10,300; +3.1%) and males (+8,200; +2.2%).

### **Accommodation & Food Services Record the Largest Job Gains**

Manitoba's service-producing sectors increased by 6,200 positions August 2024 - September 2024 (+1.1%) in September compared to August, while the goods-producing sectors decreased by 1,100 jobs (-0.7%). Employment in the serviceproducing sectors increased by 4.7% over the past year, while employment in the goods-producing sectors decreased by 4.8%. Among all industries in Manitoba, Accommodation & food services recorded the largest monthly job gain of 3,100 (+9.1%) in September, while Agriculture saw the largest job losses (-1,900; -12.7%).

Compared to the previous September, employment in Accommodation & food services industry increased by 6.9%, while Agriculture decreased by 7.7% over the same period.


# Forestry, Fishing, Mining, Quarrying, Oil & Gas Lead Hourly Wage Growth

Average hourly wages for Manitoba employees rose 1.6% (+\$0.49 to \$30.42) on a year-over-year basis in September 2024. Canada's hourly rate was up 4.6% (+\$1.58 to \$35.59) over the same period.

Manitoba's goods-producing sectors experienced a decline of 0.7% (-\$0.21 to \$30.52), while the service-producing sectors saw an above-average growth of 2.3% (+\$0.68 to \$30.39).

Forestry, fishing, mining, quarrying, oil & gas led average hourly wage growth, up 24.1% (+\$8.42 to \$43.31), while Agriculture recorded the largest decline, down by 11.9% (-\$3.18 to \$23.58) in September 2024.





## **Labour Force Survey**

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is a household survey carried out monthly by Statistics Canada.

- employment rate is the number of employed people as a percentage of the population aged 15+.
- unemployment rate is the number of unemployed people as a percentage of the labour force (employed and unemployed and looking for work).
- participation rate is the number of persons in the labour force as a percentage of the population.
- Full-time employment is the number of persons who work 30 hours+ per week at their main job.

All estimates are seasonally adjusted, unless otherwise specified. This removes seasonal and calendar effects allowing for comparisons between time periods.

The LFS estimates are based on a sample and are therefore subject to sampling variability.
