

DEMOGRAPHIC ESTIMATES QUARTERLY

July 2025

Highlights

Manitoba's total population was estimated at 1,509,702 residents as of July 1, 2025, up 1,671 individuals (0.11%) from the April 1, 2025 estimate. On a twelve-month basis (compared to July 1, 2024), Manitoba's population increased by 17,558 people, or 1.18%. After two years of extremely strong growth, Manitoba's twelve-month growth rate has slowed, fueled by significantly reduced inflows of other international migrants. Although interprovincial migration continues to hamper growth, the twelve-month net outflow is the smallest since 2020/21.

On July 1, 2025, non-permanent residents (NPRs) made up 6.00% of Manitoba's total population, down from 6.21% on April 1, 2025, and down from 6.16% on July 1, 2024. Manitoba's July 1, 2025 NPR-to-population ratio exceeded the national target of 5.00% by the equivalent of 15,112 persons.

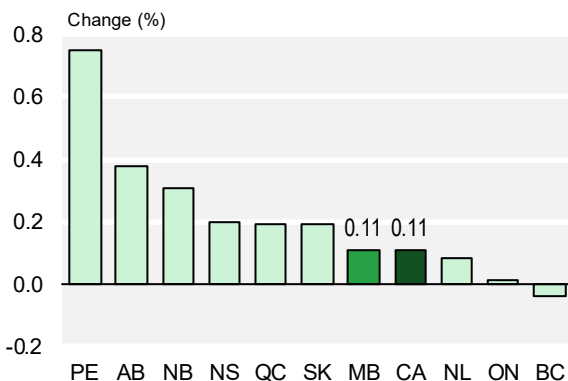
Population Growth

Quarterly growth

Over the three months ending July 2025, Manitoba's population increased by an estimated 1,671 people. Manitoba's quarterly growth rate of 0.11% was tied with Canada's 0.11%, and ranked seventh provincially.

Apr 1, 2025 to Jul 1, 2025



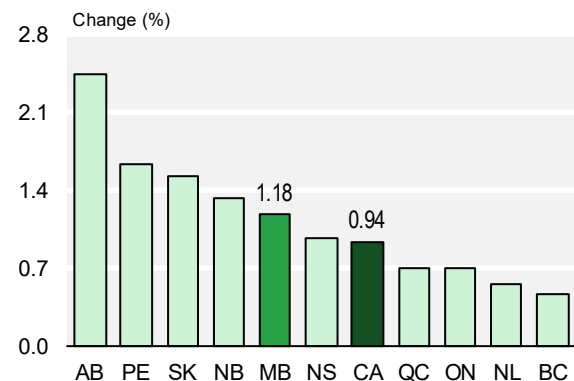

Twelve-month growth

Manitoba's population increased by an estimated 17,558 people between July 2024 and July 2025. The province's twelve-month growth rate of 1.18% was stronger than Canada's 0.94%, and ranked fifth provincially.

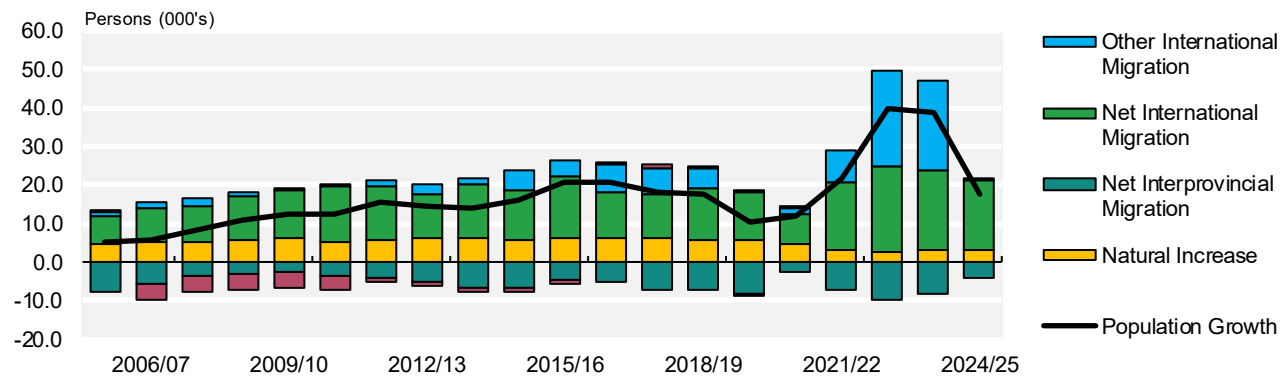

Natural Increase

During the second quarter of 2025, Manitoba recorded a gain of 1,058 people due to natural increase (births minus deaths). Over the twelve months ending June 30, 2025, Manitoba's natural increase was 2,973 people, 0.64% higher than the twelve months prior.

Total Net Migration

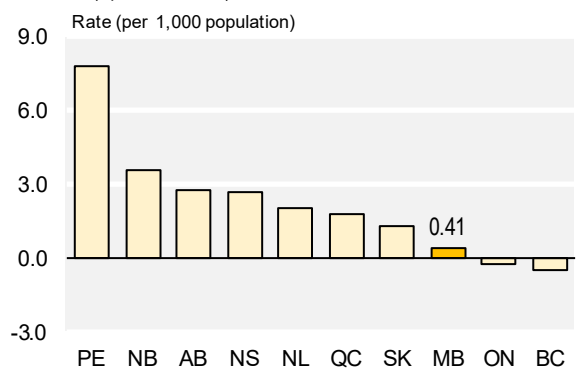
Combining all the migration components together, Manitoba had a total net inflow of 613 migrants during the second quarter of 2025. Manitoba's quarterly rate of 0.41 migrants per thousand population ranked eighth among provinces. Manitoba's twelve-month total net inflow was 14,585 migrants, 59.47% less than the previous twelve months.

Net International Migration

During the second quarter of 2025, Manitoba gained 4,167 residents through net international migration (immigrants minus short-term and long-term emigrants), resulting in a rate of 2.76 migrants per thousand population. Manitoba's net increase of 18,338 migrants between July 1, 2024 and June 30, 2025 was 10.92% lower than the net figure for the preceding twelve months.

Immigration

Focusing on the immigration portion of net international migration, Manitoba's quarterly inflow of 4,760 immigrants resulted in a rate of 3.15 immigrants per thousand population, above Canada's rate of 2.49 and first among provinces. During the twelve months ending June 30, 2025, Manitoba welcomed 21,433 immigrants, 9.14% fewer than the twelve months prior.

Other International Migration

Manitoba experienced a net loss of 2,604 other international migrants during the second quarter of 2025, resulting in a rate of -1.73 migrants per thousand population. Manitoba's net increase of 294 migrants between July 1, 2024 and June 30, 2025 was 98.76% lower than the net figure for the preceding twelve months.

Net Non-permanent Residents

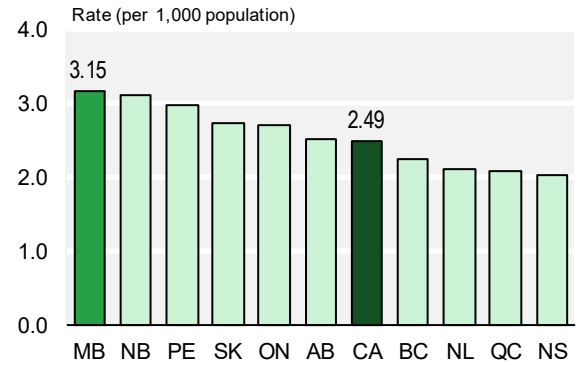
The net change in non-permanent residents portion of Manitoba's other international migration decreased significantly between 2023/24 (up 22,223 migrants) and 2024/25 (down 1,332 migrants). Data from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) suggests that three main factors likely contributed to the decline: a reduction in the number of permits issued to Post-secondary International Students; fewer International Mobility Program (IMP) permits issued to other participants (including the Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel); and a decrease in IMP permits issued to spouses of students.

Net Interprovincial Migration

Manitoba had a net interprovincial outflow of 950 migrants during the second quarter of 2025. Manitoba's quarterly rate of -0.63 migrants per thousand population ranked ninth among provinces. The province's twelve-month net interprovincial outflow was 4,047 migrants, 51.82% less than the net figure for the preceding twelve months.

Quarterly Immigration Rate

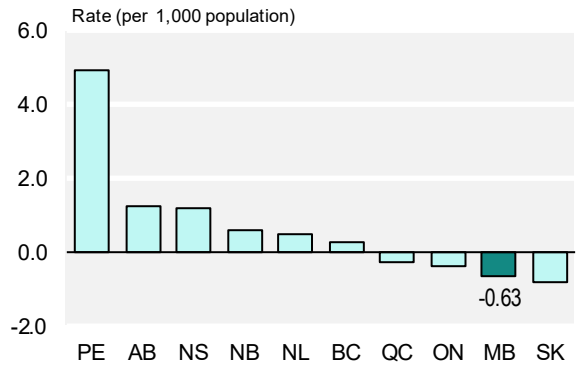
Q2-2025 (Apr 1 to Jun 30)

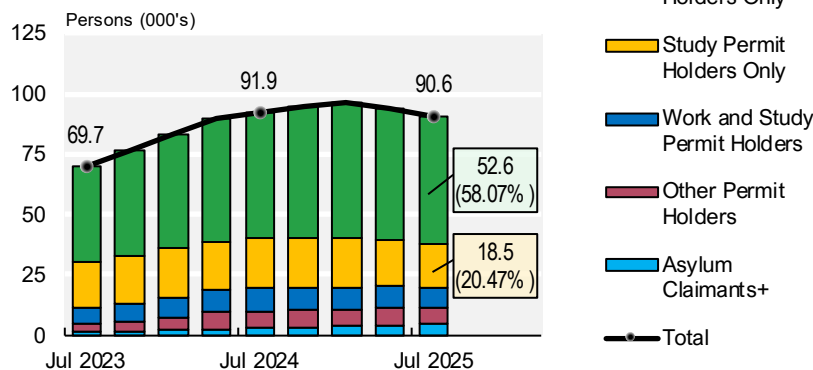
Manitoba's Non-permanent Resident Population

Manitoba's non-permanent resident population was estimated at 90,597 people as of July 1, 2025, down 3,008 individuals (-3.21%) from the April 1, 2025 estimate. The majority of Manitoba's non-permanent residents on July 1, 2025 were Work Permit Holders Only, at 58.07% (52,606 people).

On a twelve-month basis (compared to July 1, 2024) Manitoba's non-permanent resident population decreased by 1,332 people, or 1.45%. The majority, 153.45%, of the change was due to a decrease in the number of Study Permit Holders Only, 9.93% (-2,044 people) lower than the July 1, 2024 level.

Jul 1, 2023 to Jul 1, 2025 (Level)

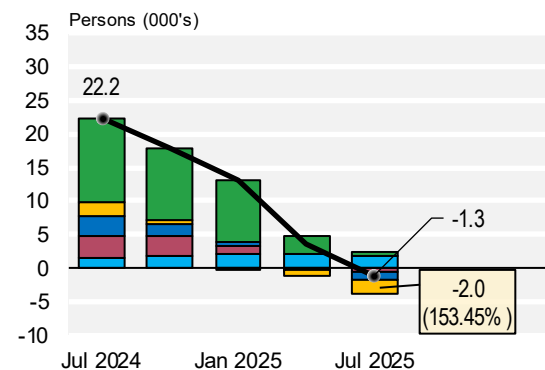

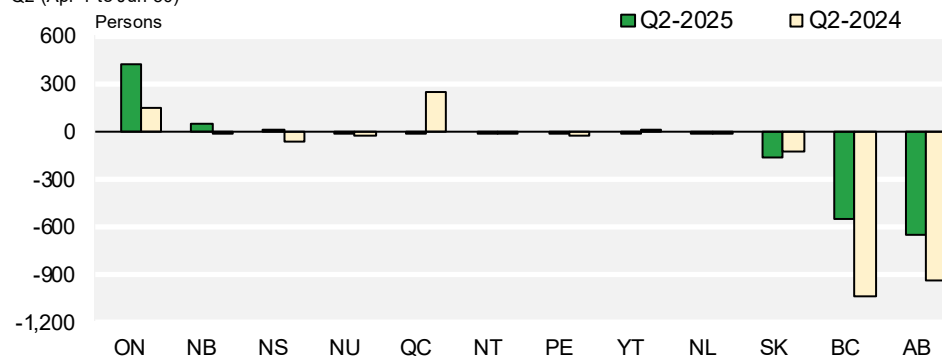
Quarterly

During the second quarter of 2025, Manitoba had net interprovincial migration gains from three jurisdictions. The largest net inflow originated from Ontario, while the largest net outflow was destined to Alberta.

Compared to the same quarter twelve months ago, Manitoba's net interchange has improved with seven jurisdictions. British Columbia improved the most, from a net loss of 1,035 migrants to a net loss of 550 migrants.

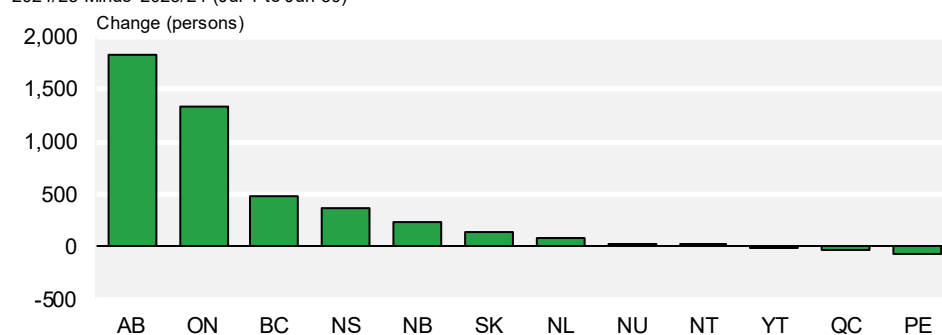
Twelve-month

Comparing the twelve months ending June 30, 2025 to the previous twelve-month period, Manitoba's net interchange has improved with nine jurisdictions. Alberta improved the most, from a net loss of 4,622 migrants to a net loss of 2,795 migrants.

During the twelve months ending June 30, 2025, Manitoba had net migration gains from six jurisdictions. The largest net inflow originated from Ontario, while the largest net outflow was destined to Alberta.

2024/25 Minus 2023/24 (Jul 1 to Jun 30)



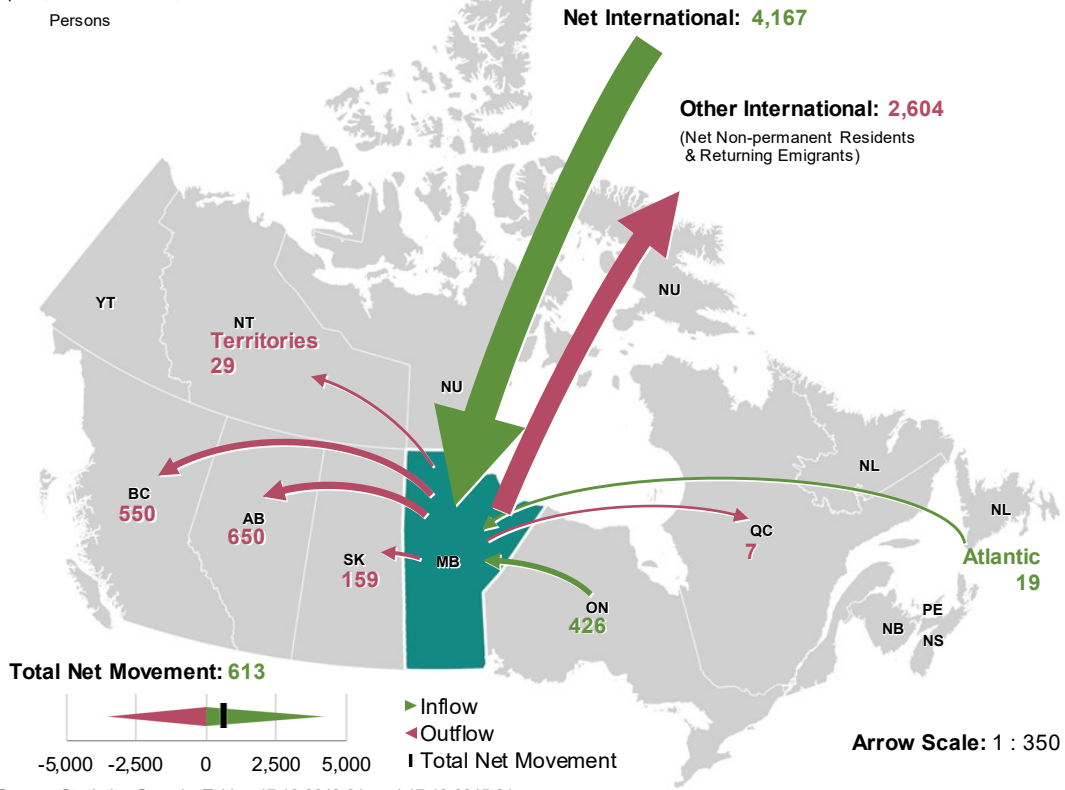

April 1, 2025 to June 30, 2025

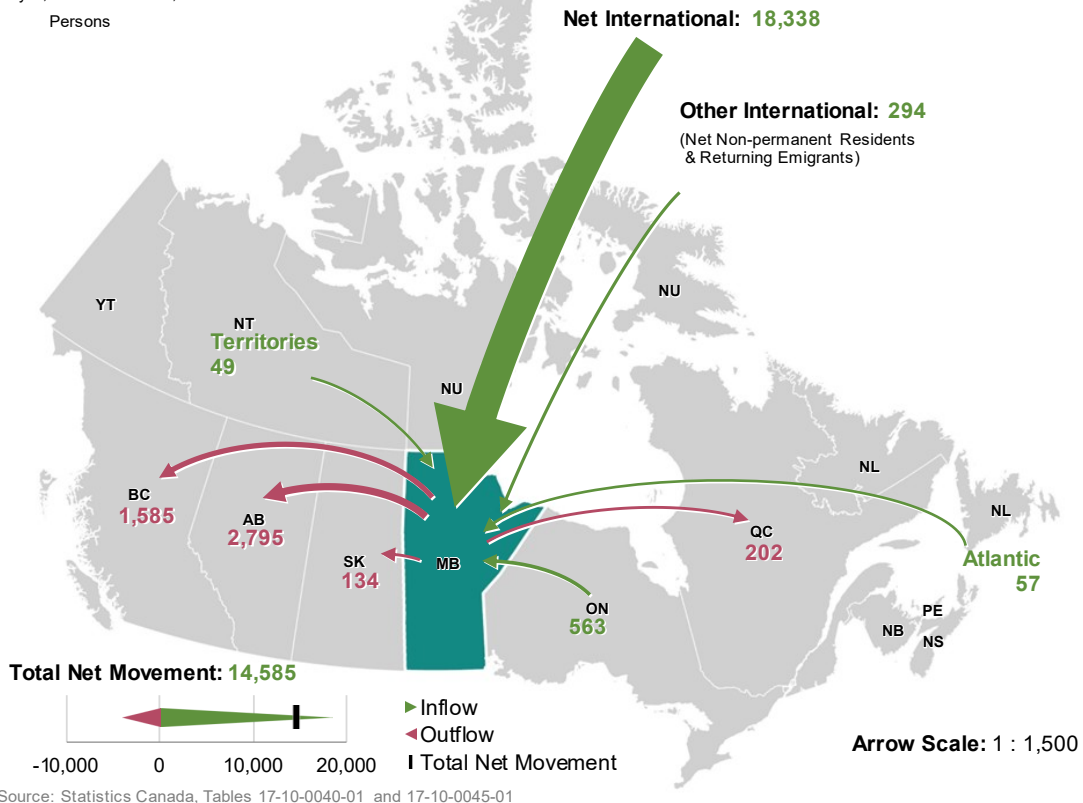

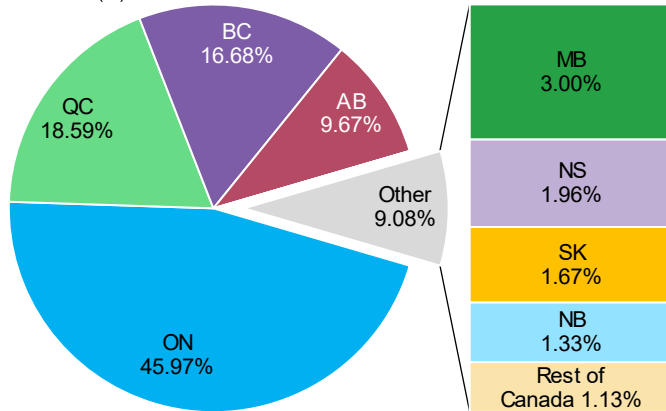

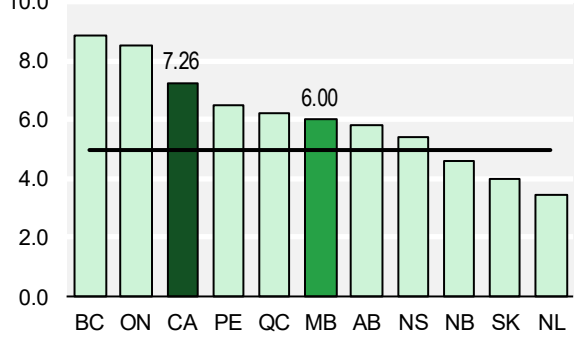

Percent (%)



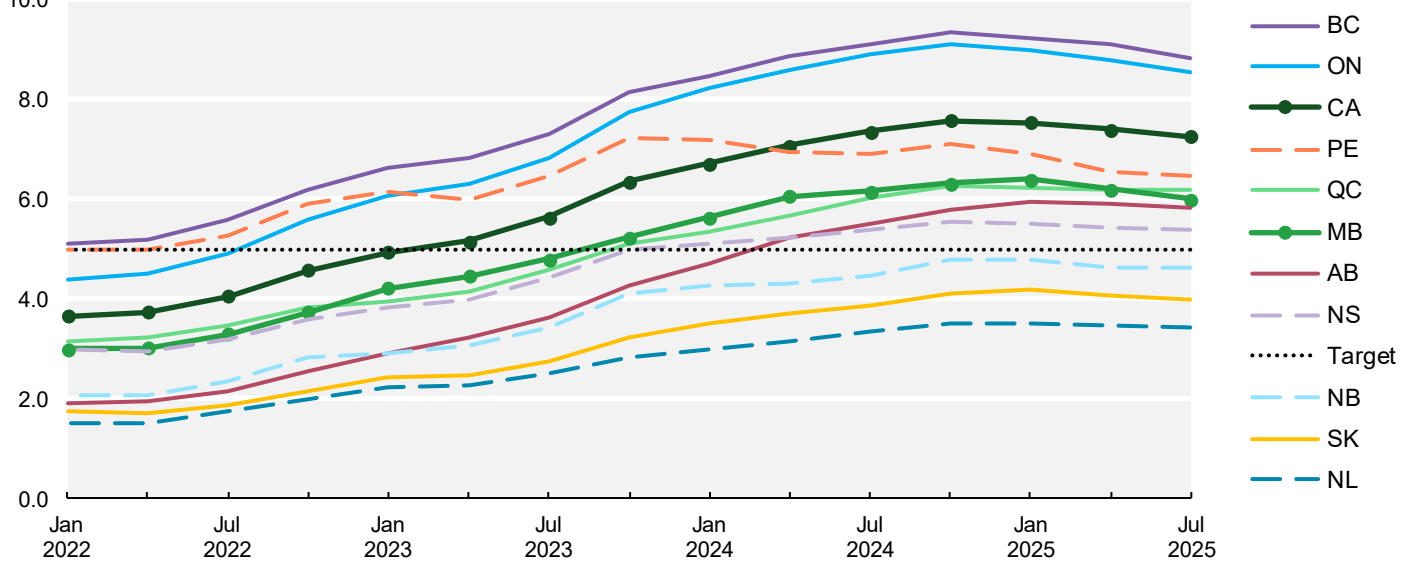

Impact of Revisions

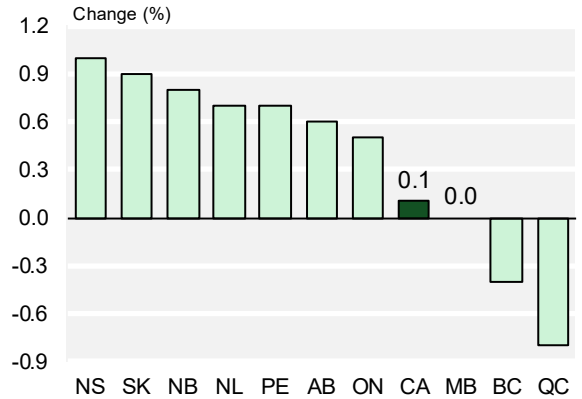
Effective with this release, Statistics Canada introduced revisions to its population estimates relative to previously published levels. The main purpose of the revisions was to reflect changes to levels for demographic components, however some adjustments to the estimation methods for non-permanent residents were also made. The revised estimates cover the time period from third quarter (July 1) 2021 onward.

The net effect of the revisions showed more people overall living in Canada than originally estimated. For Manitoba, these revisions resulted in:

- An increase in population of 701 individuals
- An increase in the net loss of persons moving to other provinces
- Lower emigration levels
- Higher levels of other international migration, mostly due to increases in net non-permanent resident estimates
- Lower levels of natural increase (births minus deaths), due to decreases in births levels

Revisions

Population and demographic estimates are revised once a year. Birth, death and migration components are revised as newer data becomes available. Additionally, after each Census, the postcensal estimates are revised to produce the intercensal estimates. Occasionally, methodological changes are also made.

Notes to Readers

Population Estimate

Estimates are derived from Census counts, but are adjusted for net Census undercoverage, incompletely enumerated Indian reserves and demographic growth.

Per '000 Population

A **rate per thousand population** is calculated by dividing the number of events for a time period by the population at the mid-point of the period, then multiplying by 1,000. These crude rates allow for quick comparisons among characteristics or jurisdictions.

In this document, the mid-point population is the average of population estimates for the start and end of the quarter.

Other International Migration

Other International Migration groups together some of the more temporary international migration flows and is comprised of the net change in Non-permanent Residents, plus long-term and short-term Returning Emigrants.

Non-permanent Residents

The majority of **Non-permanent Residents** are students and temporary workers, while the remainder are refugee status claimants and non-Canadian born dependents of refugee claimants or permit holders.

Residual

Residual deviation is obtained by distributing the error of closure linearly throughout the intercensal period.

The **error of closure** is defined as the difference between the final postcensal population estimates on Census Day and the most recent Census counts (adjusted for Census net undercoverage and incompletely enumerated reserves and settlements).

A positive error of closure means that the postcensal population estimates have overestimated the population. A negative residual would then be required to correct the overestimation.

Gains and Losses

Manitoba is considered to have a **net gain** when the number of people moving in from a given province or territory is greater than the number moving out, otherwise the **net interchange** is considered to be a **loss**.

Example: Say 28 people moved from Manitoba to Ontario and, over the same time period, 10 people moved from Ontario to Manitoba. Manitoba's resulting net interchange with Ontario would be a loss of 18 people.

Comparability over time

Estimates of population and demographic components may not be fully comparable over time due to seasonal effects, changes in methodologies and completeness of source data.

Methodology Adjustments

Birth Registration Delays

Birth estimation methods have been adjusted for Northwest Territories (March 2024) and Nova Scotia (August to December 2021, and 2023 calendar year) due to data completeness issues.

Death Registration Delays

Death estimation methods have been adjusted for Nova Scotia (2023 calendar year) due to data completeness issues.

Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET)

Since March 17, 2022, persons with a Canada-Ukraine authorization for emergency travel who are on Canadian soil are included in the Net Non-permanent Resident estimates.

Effective with the September 2025 release

Non-permanent Residents

From July 2021 onward, estimation methods for non-permanent residents have been adjusted to better account for open work permits without a province/territory of intended destination.

Effective with the September 2024 release

Non-permanent Residents

From July 2021 onward, estimation methods for non-permanent residents have been adjusted to better account for the province/territory of residence for asylum claimants, protected persons and members of related groups.

Effective with the September 2023 release

Census Base

Postcensal estimates are based on the 2021 Census counts adjusted for census net undercoverage and for incompletely enumerated reserves and settlements.

Emigration and Returning Emigration

Emigrants and Returning Emigrants include both long-term and short-term migrants from July 2016 onward. Prior to July 2016, only long-term migrants are included.

Net Temporary Emigration

From July 2016 onward, short-term Emigrants and short-term Returning Emigrants are included with Emigrants and Returning Emigrants respectively, and the Net Temporary Emigrant component is no longer being provided. Prior to July 2016, short-term Emigrants and short-term Returning Emigrants were accounted for as Net Temporary Emigrants, part of the Other International Migration component.
