

Manitoba: December 2022

Share of Manitoba businesses with employees, by sector (%)



Construction made up 10.9% of Manitoba businesses with employees

The three sectors in Manitoba with the highest number of businesses with employees were construction, retail trade, and health care. Construction made up 10.9% of the total 43,161 businesses with employees in Manitoba. Retail trade was responsible for 10.8%, and the health care sector made up another 10.8%.




The percentage of small businesses (1-99 employees) was 97.8% in Manitoba, and 98.0% in Canada. Medium businesses (100-499 employees) accounted for 1.9% of Manitoba's total, and 1.8% nationally. Large businesses (500+ employees) made up 0.3% of the total in Manitoba, and 0.2% in Canada. See appendix table 2 for a comprehensive list of business counts by employment size.

The industry in Manitoba with the highest count of small businesses was construction with 4,644 total. 2,441 of these construction businesses employed between 1 and 4 employees. Health care and social assistance had the highest count of businesses in the medium size range, with 152. Educational services had the highest count of large businesses, with 29. Real estate made up 19.6% of Manitoba businesses without employees

The three sectors in Manitoba that had the highest number of businesses without employees were real estate, agriculture, and unclassified sectors. Real estate was responsible for 19.6% of the total 86,333 businesses without employees in Manitoba.

Agriculture, which includes forestry, fishing, and hunting, made up 16.1% of the businesses in Manitoba. Unclassified sectors were the third largest category accounting for 10.9% of businesses without employees.

NOTE:

* - The "other" section for both business counts with and without employees is comprised of the thirteen sectors in each category that represent a share lower than ~5%. See appendix table 2 for full list of business counts with and without employees by industry.

Business Counts Without Employees

The counts of businesses without employees cover all enterprises which meet one of the following criteria:

- 1. Is incorporated
- 2. Shows a minimum of \$30,000 in revenue (non-taxable and/or taxable)

Business Counts With Employees

Canadian businesses included in the Business Register must meet **one** of the following criteria, and in order to qualify as a **business with employees**, businesses must meet criteria number one:

- 1. Have an employee workforce for which they submit payroll remittances to CRA
- 2. Have a minimum of \$30,000 in annual revenue
- 3. Are incorporated under a federal or provincial act and have filed a federal corporate income tax form within the past three years

Canadian Business Counts

Canadian business counts provide counts of active businesses by industry classification and employment-size categories for Canada and the provinces and territories.

Each operating location is separately counted, including cases where one business comprises multiple locations. For example, a retail business with 10 stores represents 10 businesses in the Canadian business counts.

The data does not represent changes in the business population over time. **Statistics Canada recommends that users not use the data as a time series.**

North American Industry Classification System

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is an industry classification system encompassing all economic activities. It has a hierarchical structure. At the highest level, it divides the economy into 20 sectors. At lower levels, it further distinguishes the different economic activities in which businesses are engaged.

The unclassified sector is made up of economic activities that have yet to be assigned a NAICS code.
