Manitoba Population Estimates: July 1, 2025

Statistics Canada has released its July 1, 2025 population estimates and July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025 demographic estimates for Canada, the provinces, and territories.

According to Statistics Canada, Manitoba's total population was estimated at 1,509,702 residents as of July 1, 2025, an increase of 17,558 individuals, or 1.18%, from the July 1, 2024 estimate of 1,492,144. After two years of extremely strong growth, Manitoba's twelve-month growth rate has slowed, fueled by significantly reduced inflows of other international migrants. Although interprovincial migration continues to hamper growth, the twelve-month net outflow is the smallest since 2020/21.

Net international migration (immigrants minus short-term and long-term emigrants) continues to be a major contributor to population growth, with Manitoba recording a net gain of 18,338 migrants during the twelve months ending June 30, 2025, down from 20,586 net migrants over the 2023/24 census year. Other international migration (that is, the net change in non-permanent residents plus the number of short-term and long-term returning emigrants) was an estimated net gain of 294 migrants for 2024/25. This net gain is down from the net gain of 23,801 other international migrants estimated for 2023/24.

Through interprovincial migration, Manitoba recorded an estimated net loss to other provinces and territories of 4,047 residents during 2024/25. This net loss is smaller than the net loss of 8,399 individuals in 2023/24. During 2024/25, Manitoba's largest net gains were from Ontario (563), Nova Scotia (95) and Nunavut (67). The largest net losses were to Alberta (-2,795), British Columbia (-1,585) and Quebec (-202).

Generally, Manitoba's interprovincial migration losses are offset to some degree by other forms of migration. Combining the various forms of population movement, Manitoba recorded an overall net migration gain of 14,585 people in 2024/25. This net gain marked a decrease of 21,403 individuals from the net gain of 35,988 migrants in 2023/24.

Statistics Canada has released revised demographic estimates for the third quarter 2021 onward. This MBS report incorporates all revisions. Tables 5, 6 and 7 present the differences between the current estimates and those previously published by Statistics Canada for Tables 1, 2 and 4.

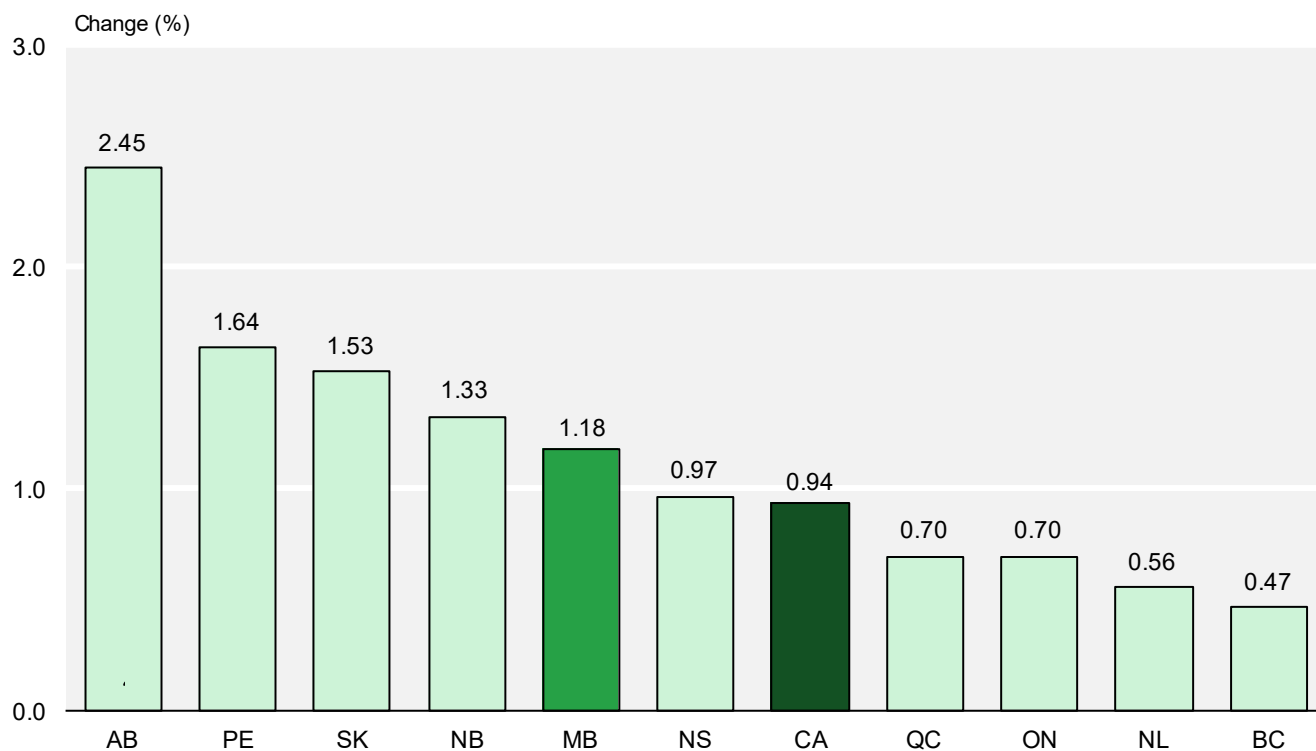

Chart 1: Population growth by province

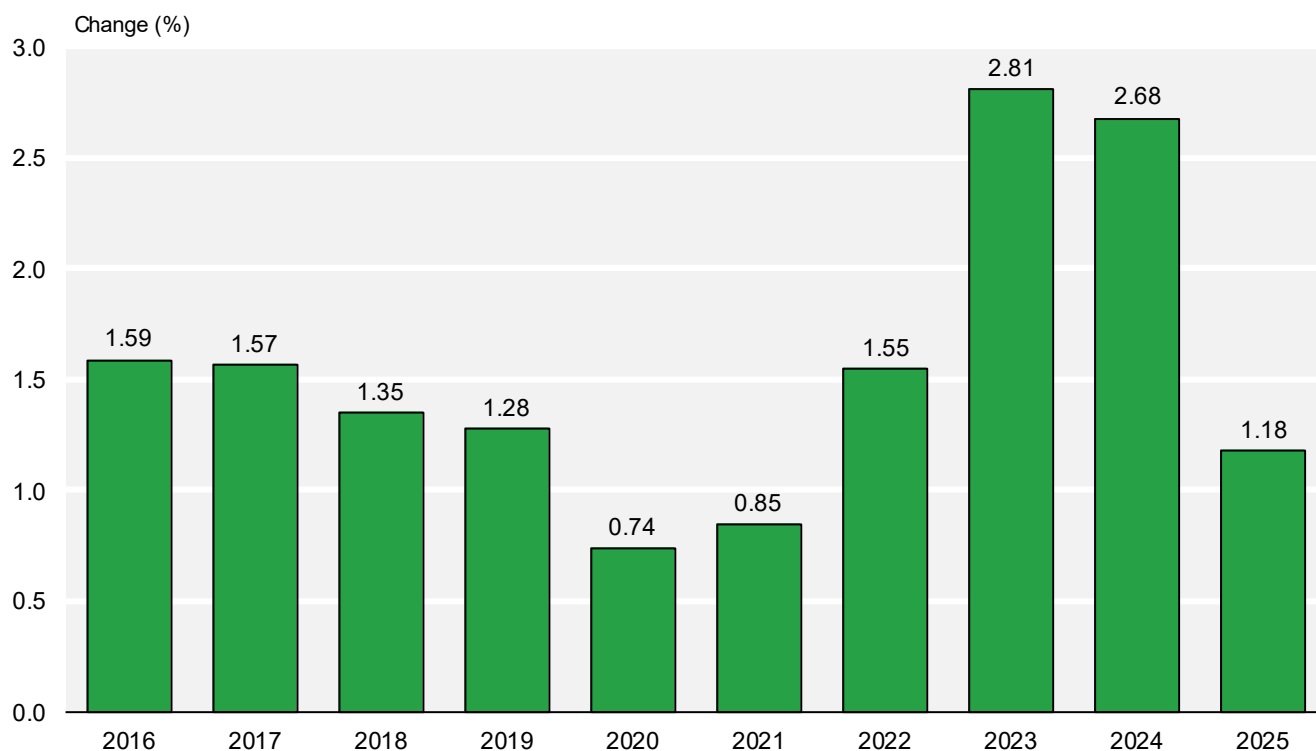
Jul 1, 2024 to Jul 1, 2025

Notes to Readers

Population Estimate

Estimates are derived from Census counts, but are adjusted for net Census undercoverage, incompletely enumerated Indian reserves and demographic growth.

Other International Migration

Other International Migration groups together some of the more temporary international migration flows and is comprised of the net change in Non-permanent Residents, plus long-term and short-term Returning Emigrants.

Non-permanent Residents

The majority of **Non-permanent Residents** are students and temporary workers, while the remainder are refugee status claimants and non-Canadian born dependents of refugee claimants or permit holders.

Residual

Residual deviation is obtained by distributing the error of closure linearly throughout the intercensal period.

The **error of closure** is defined as the difference between the final postcensal population estimates on Census Day and the most recent Census counts (adjusted for Census net undercoverage and incompletely enumerated reserves and settlements).

A positive error of closure means that the postcensal population estimates have overestimated the population. A negative residual would then be required to correct the overestimation.

Gains and Losses

Manitoba is considered to have a **net gain** when the number of people moving in from a given province or territory is greater than the number moving out, otherwise the **net interchange** is considered to be a **loss**.

Example: Say 28 people moved from Manitoba to Ontario and, over the same time period, 10 people moved from Ontario to Manitoba. Manitoba's resulting net interchange with Ontario would be a loss of 18 people.

Comparability over time

Estimates of population and demographic components may not be fully comparable over time due to seasonal effects, changes in methodologies and completeness of source data.

Methodology Adjustments

Birth Registration Delays

Birth estimation methods have been adjusted for Northwest Territories (March 2024) and Nova Scotia (August to December 2021, and 2023 calendar year) due to data completeness issues.

Death Registration Delays

Death estimation methods have been adjusted for Nova Scotia (2023 calendar year) due to data completeness issues.

Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET)

Since March 17, 2022, persons with a Canada-Ukraine authorization for emergency travel who are on Canadian soil are included in the Net Non-permanent Resident estimates.

Effective with the September 2025 release

Non-permanent Residents

From July 2021 onward, estimation methods for non-permanent residents have been adjusted to better account for open work permits without a province/territory of intended destination.

Effective with the September 2024 release

Non-permanent Residents

From July 2021 onward, estimation methods for non-permanent residents have been adjusted to better account for the province/territory of residence for asylum claimants, protected persons and members of related groups.

Effective with the September 2023 release

Census Base

Postcensal estimates are based on the 2021 Census counts adjusted for census net undercoverage and for incompletely enumerated reserves and settlements.

Emigration and Returning Emigration

Emigrants and Returning Emigrants include both long-term and short-term migrants from July 2016 onward. Prior to July 2016, only long-term migrants are included.

Net Temporary Emigration

From July 2016 onward, short-term Emigrants and short-term Returning Emigrants are included with Emigrants and Returning Emigrants respectively, and the Net Temporary Emigrant component is no longer being provided. Prior to July 2016, short-term Emigrants and short-term Returning Emigrants were accounted for as Net Temporary Emigrants, part of the Other International Migration component.
