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Expanding a hen hatchery may not be a good idea for a number of reasons, including:

- 1. Environmental impact: Hen hatcheries generate a significant amount of waste, including manure and other noxious byproducts. Expanding a hatchery increases the amount of waste produced, which can have negative environmental impacts such as pollution, increased level of ammonia and greenhouse gas emissions. As a resident of RM of Tache in close proximity with the hatchery, under the current animal capacity the air quality has been impacted since they started their operations. Intense hens farming confined in relatively small spaces can result in high levels of ammonia and other gases being emitted into the air. These gases contribute to poor air quality and can have negative impacts on human health, other small farm animals in the area, wildlife, the environment and limit residents to enjoy outdoor recreational activities due to the noxious fumes.
- 2. Animal welfare concerns: Expanding a hen hatchery can lead to overcrowding and poor living conditions for the birds that increase the risk of sick and injured birds. This can result in increased stress, disease, and significant mortality rates among the hens. In addition, if the expansion goes through and there is all of the sudden a market saturation the hatchery will be forced to incur unnecessarily in higher euthanasia rates in response to the market trends.

I would 100% support sustainable farming with animal welfare practices at the core of their operations. However, based on the proposal for expansion they are not making any modification to the per animal units' ratio of 120.4 used with the current population, meaning they are overlooking the NFACC transition recommendation to enriched cages which requires a larger area. As a concerned resident and very much impacted by a possible expansion of Steinbach Hatchery operation I firmly oppose to the proposal TRC 12-097
