Good Morning.

We are wanting to share our concerns over the proposed livestock expansion.

We have no issues with either proposal for expansion in regards to the increase in livestock numbers.

We do have concerns regarding the rural roads around that area. Rd 35W between Rd 42N and Rd 43N is not suitable for the increase of livestock or Ag equipment that will be moving from the main yard to the secondary sites. The road is very narrow, you cannot meet on coming equipment safely. During wet times the large equipment completely destroys that area, making it harder for vehicles to safely drive down that road. I have talked to a few people who have actually slid into the ditch in that stretch meeting oncoming ag equipment.

Out only concerns are the state of that road and how more equipment will impact the safety of travel on that stretch.

Good afternoon

We have some issues with the runoff of overland water with the proposed expansion of dairy for divorce farms

The water from the 1/4's run into our 1/4 of sw 3-8-6 and gets held there until water levels get high enough and then goes out to the south east corner of the 1/4 and keeps going across private farmland

So in essence we have the settling pond for all the water to the west of us and this should be corrected before any more animal units gets approved

The RM of grey needs to build a ditch from the corner of road 33w/42n all the way to the corner of 31w/42n

As of now the water from the west gets diverted north at the corner of 33w/42n and then crosses the road(33w) to the east and then runs straight north into the settling pond for others

There is a permit in place for an outlet out of that settling pond but it has to get quite high and with more manure runoff it shouldn't be up to us to hold it, and it also affects surrounding farmland
