Granville Lake is located on a peninsula on the south shore of Granville Lake, which is part of the Churchill River system. There are no longer any permanent residents.

Access

Normal access is by boat, snowmobile or air. Leaf Rapids is 42 kilometres northeast by air.

Economic Overview

The area lies within the Precambrian Shield region of the province, characterized by granite and gneissic rocks overlaid with a thin muskeg cover. The many lakes are suited for fishing, hunting and recreational purposes. Commercial fishing takes place on Granville Lake, Stag Lake, Watt Lake and Barrington Lake.
