

DECLARATION PROCESS CHANGE FOR 2023 - PENDING

For **2023**, landowners will have to supply documented proof that the landowner owns the lands declared. Proof will be required through tax records and/or land title records. Lands that are owned by corporations will also have to supply a current listing of shareholders. The documentation will be required before the application opening date of May 1, 2023.

If you are a first time applicant to the Multi-level Draw Program and have never created an elicencing account, please create your account and personal profile from the elicencing Home Page.

If you have purchased any type of licence since 2020 (hunting, angling, trapping licences, park vehicle pass, timber or Christmas tree permits), you will have a profile already created in the elicencing program **do not create another profile**.

An applicant for an Elk Landowner Draw Licence must hold a minimum total of one-quarter section (145 acres) of land within the Game Hunting Area(s) for which they apply.

Your Declaration of Lands Owned must be submitted and approved prior to your Elk Landowner Draw Application being available on your online profile. The application can be downloaded from: www.gov.mb.ca/fish-wildlife/pubs/fish_wildlife/hunting/landownereik_declaration.pdf or see page 12.

The deadline for submission of your Declaration of Lands Owned is **May 15th**.

General Information about the Licence Draws

The draw application deadline is **May 31** (11:59 pm). Applications must be registered online at www.manitobaelicensing.ca by this date and time.

Draw licences are only available through the draw process **once** a year.

Applicants must be residents of Manitoba and must hold a minimum total of one-quarter section (145 acres) of land within the Game Hunting Area(s) for which they apply.

There are two separate draw programs:

- The Big Game Draw program is for resident moose and elk hunting licences.
- The Elk Landowner Draw program is for resident landowners only.

Separate applications must be completed for the Big Game Draw or the Elk Landowner Draw (dependent on landowner eligibility). Only one application is allowed for each draw. All applicants are provided a personal priority level in the Multi-Level Draw system. Personal priority levels for the Big Game Draw and Elk Landowner Draw are independent of each other.

Your current priority level is available to view on your customer profile.

The Elk Landowner Draw is held first. Applicants who apply for both the Big Game and Elk Landowner Draws are advised that, if they are successful in the Elk Landowner Draw, they will lose their opportunity to be drawn for the Big Game Draw. An applicant who has applied to the Big Game Draw with a partner who is a successful applicant in the Elk Landowner Draw will lose the opportunity to be drawn for the Big Game Draw.

A draw licence is valid only in the area(s) and hunting season(s) for which it is issued and, in the case of an Elk Landowner Draw Licence, only on land owned by the landowner.

Residents of Manitoba may hold only one of the following licences: draw moose, draw moose archery, draw elk, draw elk archery, or draw elk landowner. Draw moose and draw moose archery licence holders are not eligible to purchase a non-draw (general) moose licence, a non-draw (general) conservation moose licence or a non-draw archery moose licence.

Youth hunting provisions for shared bag options are extended to include all draw licences, and the same qualifications and privileges apply. Youth can apply for a licence, or, a youth may hunt with a person who has obtained a draw licence via the shared bag option.

Hunting Season Choices (HSC)

Every year, Manitoba Natural Resources and Northern Development establishes the hunting season choices for the Big Game and Elk Landowner Draws based on game hunting area, season date, bag limit (per game tag) and number of licences/game tags available. The number of hunting licences/game tags available for draw hunting seasons may change at any point should conditions warrant. Applications must be completed by hunters either as individuals or in pairs dependent upon the hunting season choice. Licences are awarded in licence and game tag combinations as described for each hunting season choice as listed on the website www.gov.mb.ca/fish-wildlife/index.html

NOTE: Hunting Season Choices may change from year to year; please review your choice(s) carefully.

Priority Levels

The Draw program is based on 10 priority levels. In the Multi-Level Draw system, Level 1 is the most favourable level and Level 10 is the least favourable level. A personal priority level is assigned to each individual. An application with two applicants is entered into the draw system at the least favourable personal priority level of both applicants. First-time applicants (an applicant who has not applied for a draw licence since 1996) will be assigned a personal priority level of Level 8. Applications are processed randomly and sequentially in the draw system according to priority level and hunting season choices. All Level 1 applications are processed first.

Personal priority levels will improve one level in the following year for each draw year that an applicant is not successful in being awarded a draw licence. Unsuccessful applicants already at Level 1 will remain at Level 1. Successful applicants awarded a licence will be assigned to Level 10 next year.

Hunters who have applied in the draw in 1996 or later do not need to apply every year in order to advance their priority level for that draw. The Multi-level Draw system will automatically advance their personal priority level each year if their account is not in penalty. However, in order to be awarded a licence, an application and payment must be submitted online into the draw in that year. Applicants who are excluded from draw participation due to an unpaid debt will have their personal priority level frozen and will be excluded from all licence draws regardless of the origin of the debt.

Your current priority level will be listed on your personal profile on the elicensing website.

Notification of Licence Award

Results of the draw will be **emailed** to each applicant by **June 21**. It is up to each applicant to ensure that your email is current. Payment must be made by the credit card on file by **July 15**. Failure to complete payment will result in the licence(s) being cancelled and penalty status to be placed on the account of all applicants on that application.

Hunting Information

For applicants who apply as a pair, the successful pair must observe party hunting regulations. Either licensee may hunt alone; however, they must have the game tag on their person.

Every person who kills an elk in Game Hunting Area 23 or 23A shall, within 48 hours, deliver the complete head, upper neck, lungs and trachea (windpipe) of the elk to a designated Drop-Off Depot.

Every person who kills an elk in Game Hunting Area 5, 6, 6A, 11, 12, 13, 13A, 18 part only, 18A, 18B (west of Provincial Trunk Highway 366), 18C, or 22 (west of Provincial Trunk Highway 83) shall, within 48 hours, deliver the complete head and upper neck of the elk to a designated Drop-Off Depot.

Manitoba Natural Resources and Northern Development and Riding Mountain National Park staff will be conducting aerial surveys of the elk population as part of the bovine tuberculosis management program. Hunters may see low-flying aircraft while hunting. Every effort will be made to minimize the disturbance to hunters. (LE6*)

Hunters must possess and be able to produce a valid Hunter Education Certificate if requested by an officer.

Licences are not transferable. Unallocated draw licences will not be made available.

If a licence is lost or destroyed, it must be reprinted. If a game tag is lost or destroyed, a replacement licence and game tag must be applied for in person through a District Office or at 200 Saulteaux Crescent in Winnipeg. Please see the Hunting Guide for directions or call Manitoba Customer Information Unit 1-800-214-6497. The replacement licence and game tag will cost \$10.50.

Licences and game tags that are not deliverable must be processed through the replacement licence and game tag process. Please see the Hunting Guide or contact Manitoba Customer Information Unit at 1-800-214-6497 for more information.

Conditions of the Elk Landowner Draw and Licences

Failing to comply with the conditions for a big game hunting licence or making a false statement in an application for such a licence are offences contrary to Section 59 of The Wildlife Act. In addition, a person whose hunting privileges are suspended for all hunting or big game hunting must not apply for or obtain a big game hunting licence.

Only residents of Manitoba may apply for an Elk Landowner Draw licence.

An Elk Landowner Draw licence is valid only in the area(s) and hunting season(s) for which it is issued.

An Elk Landowner Draw Licence is valid **only on land owned by the landowner**.

All applicants for an Elk Landowner Draw Licence must possess a valid Hunter Education Certificate.

Only one application form may be submitted for an Elk Landowner Draw licence (a person's name may appear on only one Elk Landowner Draw application).

The first applicant on an application for an Elk Landowner Draw Licence **must** be a **registered landowner** in the Game Hunting Area(s) chosen on the application form, with the exception that the landowner's spouse may apply for and be issued a licence and game tag, provided that the registered owner does not apply for such a licence. A Director of a Corporation that owns land in the Game Hunting Area(s) may exercise the rights of a registered landowner, with the exception that the spouse of a Director may not apply in place of the Director.

An applicant for an Elk Landowner Draw Licence must hold a minimum total of one quarter section (145 acres) of land within the Game Hunting Area(s) for which they apply.

Where a landholding is owned by multiple registered owners, the number of owners who can apply is limited by the total size of the landholding within the Game Hunting Area. For each additional registered landowner applying, the holding must contain an additional one quarter section of land. For example, land held by four registered owners must total at least four quarter sections within the Game Hunting Area for all four owners to be eligible to apply. If the holding totals only three quarter sections, then only

three of the owners are eligible to apply. Each quarter section of land must be a minimum of 145 acres.

Some long-term landowners, pre-1996, with less than one quarter section but more than 80 acres may be eligible to apply for a licence. Call 204-945-4042 for further details.

Where an application for an Elk Landowner Draw Licence bears the names of two applicants, the second applicant must be an **immediate family member of the first applicant**. It is not necessary to have a second applicant on an application.

An immediate family member for the purpose of this application is a spouse, child, parent, grandchild, grandparent, brother or sister of the first applicant.

Successful landowner applicants will be awarded a licence and game tag. However, successful applicants who have applied as an immediate family member will not be awarded a separate game tag and will share one game tag with the registered landowner.

Any youth applying for the draw must be at least 12 years old at the application deadline date as the application will not be available on their profile.

Applications for the Elk Landowner Draw must have a complete and valid Declaration of Lands Owned form submitted by May 15, and approved in order to access the Elk Landowner Draw application.

The approval process of the Declaration of Lands Owned can take up to 10 days to review. It is the landowner's responsibility to check your profile to access your landowner application. Due to the volume of declarations, we are unable to notify landowners when your application is open or verify receipt of declaration.

The Declaration of Lands Owned must list all of the landowners for the land chosen as the hunting season choice. For example, the joint tenants must be listed.

The application form must list the same hunting season choices as the Declaration of Lands Owned.

Applications will only be processed online. Customers are encouraged to enter their application through their online account or through the call centre at 1-877-880-1203. Applications may be entered online at District Offices, but are subject to Covid-19 and operational restrictions. It is the applicant's sole responsibility to ensure their completed applications are submitted by the deadline.

Any application and declaration forms not completed or not submitted in compliance with the conditions for a draw licence as set out herein is invalid and will be rejected from the draw.

Applicants with outstanding fees will have their personal priority level frozen until the outstanding balance is paid.

It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that their mailing address is updated, correct,

and complete on their licensing profile. Licences and game tags that are not deliverable are not the department's responsibility.

Hunting Season Choice (HSC) Closures

If a decision has been made to close a season before the draw is run, an application will be processed as follows:

- If the closed HSC was the only choice on the application, the application is removed from the draw and all monies, except the administration fee of \$4.50, are refunded.
- If there were other HSCs on the application, the closed season is removed and the other HSCs are valid for the purposes of entering the application in the draw.

How to Complete the Online Application Form for the Elk Landowner Draw

Before proceeding with these steps, please read and understand the sections on General Information and Conditions of the Draw and Licences.

It is each applicant's responsibility to ensure that their information is correct and accurate. Any application with 2 (two) applicants, is considered 1 (one) application.

Please review your online application carefully.

On each customer profile, the following fields are mandatory and must be validated:

- Manitoba Driver's Licence Number or another identifier must be used (passport, military card)
- indicate male or female, prefer not to say or other
- date of birth
- surname, first name and middle name
- **complete mailing address**
- valid Hunter Education Certificate
- email address
- telephone number
- height, hair and eye colour

Select Hunting Season Choice(s)

Under Hunting Season Choice, select the **letter/number** combination from the Hunting Season Choice chart that corresponds to your first and second choices and the GHA(s) you wish to hunt. One choice is sufficient. It is not necessary to complete both choices. You should only make choices you are prepared to accept because **exchanges and/or refunds are not allowed.**

Hunting Season Choices may change each year; please review your choice(s) carefully.

Declaration of Lands Owned form must be completed by May 15 and approved in order to access the Elk Landowner Draw. Please see below for details on how to complete the Declaration of Lands Owned form.

Payment

Only credit card payments are accepted through the elicencing website and must be on the applicant's profile upon submission. Visa and MasterCard are the only credit cards accepted for payment.

Application fees for each applicant include a non-refundable \$7.00 application fee and a non-refundable \$4.50 administration fee for a total fee of \$11.50

If an application is successful in securing a draw licence(s), **the first applicant or group leader** will be charged for each licence issued with that application, plus the \$4.50 administration fee for each licence

One Licence - $\$57.25 + \$4.50 = \$61.75$

Two Licences - $\$114.50 + \$9.00 = \$123.50$

Total licence fees include 5% G.S.T. and a portion of the fee is for wildlife conservation and a \$4.50 administration fee.

The draw application deadline is **May 31** at 11:59 pm. Applications must be submitted online at www.manitobaelicensing.ca by this date and time.

Payments will appear on your credit card statement as RAO MB Licensing.

Late or Non-Payment of Awarded Licence(s)

Awarded licence payments must be made by **July 15, 2022**. Failure to process the licence payment required for the successful application will result in the licences being voided and the applicants will be placed in penalty status.

After the **July 15** deadline, for applicants in penalty status, all future hunting and angling privileges will be suspended until the outstanding licence fee(s) is/are received. Contact 1-800-214-6497 for payment arrangements. Licences will not be reissued after this date.

How to Complete the Declaration of Lands Owned form for the Elk Landowner Draw Licence

The Landowner Declaration of Lands Owned form is available from the Fish and Wildlife Branch website www.gov.mb.ca/fish-wildlife/pubs/fish_wildlife/hunting/landownerelk_declaration.pdf or on page Please download this form and complete all the required information. This document should be emailed to elicensing@gov.mb.ca by **May 15** for verification. Allow 10 business days for processing. Once it is determined that all information is correct, the landowner will be able to access a landowner elk draw application on their profile.

It is the responsibility of the landowner to check their profile for the availability of the landowner application. Please allow 10 business days for processing.

For each Declaration, complete in the spaces provided:

- surname, first name and middle initial
- address and postal code
- **nearest district office where the land is located**
- hunting season choice(s)
- a legal description of lands owned
- number of acres per title
- date of property ownership
- type of ownership
- names of owners
- signature and date

All lands listed must be owned by the first applicant.

The landowner must be listed on the declaration (names of owners).

Allocation of Awarded Licences and Game Tags

Successful applicants will automatically receive the awarded licence(s) and assigned game tags once payment is completed. Game tags are assigned to each awarded licences through the online program and are delivered, with the licences, to the first applicant or group leader by Canada Post.

For the awarded licences, assigned game tags are not available through retail vendors, district offices, or drawn from your own pack of game tags. The awarded licences and assigned game tags are processed and sent to the group leader with Canada Post mailing services. Please ensure the mailing address is correct at the draw deadline.

If unused, game tags are not transferable to another hunting licence.

Please ensure your mailing address is correct.

Licences and game tags that are not delivered are not the department's responsibility.

Undelivered licences and game tags must be replaced with a replacement licence and game tag.

Please see below for instructions.

Rejection of Applications

An application will be rejected if any of the following apply:

- The payment is not able to be processed.
- The application bears the name of an ineligible applicant.
- The information on the Declaration of Lands Owned form is incorrect, missing or invalid.

Successful Applicants

Successful applicants will receive an email indicating their success in the draw and licence payment will be processed on the credit card on file.

- Licence(s) and the game tag(s) are sent to the mailing address as indicated on the application.
- Payment is processed **immediately** after the draw is completed to the credit card as listed on the application.
- If a payment fails, the online program will attempt to process the payment again.
- It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure payment is received.
- The applicant should call **licensing Help Desk at 1-877-880-1203** regarding payment issues before the payment deadline of July 30.
- If a payment is unable to be processed by **July 30**, the licence(s) will be voided.
- Failure to pay for licence(s) will result in the applicant being placed in penalty status.
- Any other hunting and angling purchases after this date will not be processed until the outstanding licence fees are paid and penalty status removed.

Unsuccessful Applications

- Unsuccessful and rejected applicants will receive an email indicating the results of the draw.

Outstanding Licences and Payments from Previous Years

Any applicant with outstanding fees from previous draw years will be unable to purchase any hunting or fishing licence until the outstanding fee is paid. The applicant should call Manitoba Customer Information Unit at **1-800-214-6497** to resolve these outstanding fees.

Licences and Game Tags – missing, lost, damaged, stolen, and undelivered

Missing, lost, damaged, or stolen licences may be reprinted from your profile.

Missing, lost, damaged, or stolen game tags must be replaced with both a replacement licence and game tag.

Undelivered licences and game tags must be replaced with a replacement licence and game tag.
