### **OVERVIEW:**

The Proposal was dated and received on November 27, 1997. The advertisement of the Proposal read as follows:

"A Proposal filed by the Manitoba Department of Highways and Transportation to reconstruct the Birdtail Sioux First Nation Access Road from Provincial Trunk Highway 83 in the Rural Municipality of Miniota westerly for approximately 8.3 km to the Birdtail Indian Reserve No. 57. The proposed reconstruction will meet Provincial Highway standards. The work consists of acquiring additional right-of-way, improving curve alignments, widening the existing grade and future asphalt paving. The project is cost shared between The Manitoba Department of Highways and Transportation and the Birdtail Sioux First Nation outside the reserve boundary. The Birdtail Sioux First Nation will fund all costs within the reserve boundary. The Manitoba Department of Highways and Transportation will proceed with finalizing project design details and land acquisition once all Provincial and Federal government agencies' requirements have been met."

The Proposal was advertised in the Birtle Eye Witness on Monday, December 8, 1997. It was made available for public review at registries located at the Manitoba Eco-Network, the Centennial Public Library, the Border Regional Library in Virden. It was also distributed to the "Transportation" TAC members for comment. All comments were requested by January 6, 1997.

## **PUBLIC RESPONSE**

No public comments were received in response to the Environment Act advertisement of the Proposal.

Guidelines for the Protection of Fish and Fish Habitat" (1996).

# Recommendation

Public hearings on the Proposal are not recommended. It is recommended that the Proposal be Licenced under the Environment Act as proposed and in accordance with the limits, terms and conditions as noted in the attached draft Environment Act Licence.
