In accordance with the Manitoba Environment Act (C.C.S.M. c. E125) THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

BEAUSEJOUR AUTO WRECKING/DENNIS ROMANIUK: APPLICANT

The following limits, terms, and conditions shall be complied with in connection with the operation of an auto wrecking facility located on Parcel A, Plan 20861, in the NW 1/4 1-13-7E in the Town of Beausejour.

- 1. The Applicant shall collect all drained fluids (battery acid, gasoline, anti-freeze, crankcase and differential fluids, brake and power cleaning fluids), and safely store the fluids in water tight and covered containers prior to re-use or final disposal.
- 2. The Applicant shall ensure that each container in which fluids are stored is clearly marked on the side and on the top surface identifying the type of fluid therein.
- 3. The Applicant shall ensure that the periodic disposal of collected fluids occurs by delivery to a facility that is equipped to safely recycling or destroy such liquids.
- The Applicant shall maintain a record of such disposal required by Clause 3, recording the date, quantity, and type of liquid removed for recycle or disposal and the location of such recycling/disposal.
- 5. The Applicant shall ensure that no battery breaking takes place at the site. All batteries are to be stored upright, and periodically removed to a facility that is equipped to safely recycle or destroy batteries.
- 6. The Applicant shall ensure that no open burning takes place on the site.

- 7. The Applicant shall ensure that vehicles are placed with an open space existing on all four sides of each vehicle and that vehicles be placed in such a manner that allows access to all areas of the vehicle storage compound by mobile fire fighting equipment.
- 8. The Applicant shall ensure that a non-see through fence eight feet in height is constructed around the perimeter of the property on which wrecked vehicles and vehicles used for parts are placed and/or stored and that all fencing is kept in good repair.
- 9. The Applicant shall ensure that there is no stacking of vehicles.
- 10. The Applicant shall ensure that there is no storage and/or stacking of parts associated with the operation above the height of the fence prescribed in Clause 8.
- 11. The Applicant shall ensure that the vehicle and parts storage area is properly maintained such that:
 - (a) vegetation is controlled as deemed necessary by the Environment Officer.
 - (b) vehicles, parts, other materials are stored in such a manner that the site can readily be maintained pursuant to Clause 11 (a) and Clause 7.
- 12. The Applicant shall ensure that all of the above limits, terms and conditions are in effect by November 1, 1991.
- 13. The Applicant shall ensure that after November 1, 1991, all wrecked vehicles and/or vehicles used for parts are contained within the fenced area as prescribed in Clause 8.
