In accordance with the Manitoba Environment Act (C.C.S.M. c.E125)

THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: The "Licencee"

for the construction, operation and maintenance of the Development being the realignment of Provincial Road #268 beginning in the Rural Municipality of Minitonas and extending a distance of 2.5 km. in a northwesterly direction across the Swan River near the Community of Lenswood in the Local Government District of Mountain subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS, AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal, Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Road #268 in the Vicinity of Lenswood, dated September 1993.
- 2. The Licencee shall, during construction of the Swan River crossing, adhere to the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources' guidelines titled Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba.
- 3. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, consult and reach an agreement with Environment Canada, Fisheries and Oceans regarding acceptable preservatives to be used for the treatment of timbers in the construction of the Swan River bridge replacement.
- 4. The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that any fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from waterbodies, and ensure the storage areas comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation.
- 5. The Licencee shall, during and upon completion of construction of the Development, collect and dispose of all waste petroleum products generated by the construction activities in accordance with all applicable regulatory requirements.

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- 6. The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to Manitoba Regulation 150/91R -Waste Disposal Grounds Regulation.
- 7. The Licencee shall, at the completion of the construction of the Development, landscape and vegetate all areas disturbed during the construction with native and/or introduced plant species. Rip-rap or similar erosion control materials shall be used to prevent erosion in areas where vegetative cover cannot be established.

REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms or conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke, temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
