In accordance with the Manitoba Environment Act (C.C.S.M. c. E125)

THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRICT OF FISHER: "the Licencee"

for the construction of the Development being the construction of one half mile of new road and the construction of a ford crossing of the East Branch of the Fisher River located east of N 5-25-1W in the Local Government District of Fisher subject to the following specifications, terms and conditions:

- 1) The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal filed on June 25, 1993 and the Engineering Report titled *Evaluation of a Proposed Ford Crossing of the East Fisher River*, filed as additional information to the Environment Act Proposal on July 11, 1994.
- The Licencee shall, during construction of the crossing of the East Branch of the Fisher River, adhere to the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources' guidelines titled Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba.
- The Licencee shall, two weeks prior to beginning construction on the stream crossing of the East Branch of the Fisher River notify the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources Regional Fisheries Biologist to arrange for an on-site inspection of the work, including the use of rip-rap, the installation of sediment traps and mitigation measures of fisheries habitat loss.
- 4) The Licencee shall, from April 1 to June 15 of each year during construction, cease all construction activities that may impact upon the stream channel and banks of the East Branch of the Fisher River which may affect fish mobility and fish habitat.
- 5) The Licencee shall, during construction of the road upgrade, direct drainage from disturbed areas away from the East Branch of the Fisher River and towards undisturbed vegetated areas.
- 6) The Licencee shall, during construction of the Development, minimize disturbance to the stream banks and vegetation adjacent to the crossing.
- 7) The Licencee shall, during construction of the Development, use sediment control traps. The traps shall be cleaned of silt and debris following construction.

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- 8) The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that any fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development and any heavy equipment repair and maintenance associated with the construction of the Development, are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from waterbodies. The storage and equipment maintenance areas shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation.
- 9) The Licencee shall, during and following completion of construction of the Development, collect and dispose of all waste petroleum products generated by the construction activities in accordance with all applicable regulatory requirements.
- 10) The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to Manitoba Regulation 150/91R -Waste Disposal Grounds Regulation.

REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
