In accordance with the Manitoba Environment Act (C.C.S.M. c. E125)

THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: "the Licencee"

for the construction and operation of the Development being the upgrading of Provincial Trunk Highway #5 beginning at Roblin in the Rural Municipality of Shell River and proceeding in an easterly direction to the PTH #5 / PR #584 intersection in the Rural Municipality of Hillsburg subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Department of Highways & Transportation Environment Act Proposal, *Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Trunk Highway #5 (from Roblin to PR #584)*, dated June 21, 1994.
- 2. The Licencee shall, prior to beginning construction of the Development, consult and reach an agreement with the Department of Natural Resources Regional Wildlife staff, regarding a site specific plan to minimize disturbance to waterfowl production on the wetland areas affected by the Development.
- 3. The Licencee shall, during the full term of construction of the Development, implement the plan agreed to pursuant to Clause 2 of this Licence.
- 4. The Licencee shall, prior to construction of the Development, notify the Department of Natural Resources Regional Wildlife staff regarding the preconstruction meeting scheduled to be held in accordance with the *Proposed Environmental Management Practices* identified under *Section 1.9* of the *Environment Act Proposal Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Trunk Highway* #5 (from Roblin to PR #584), dated June 21, 1994.
- 5. The Licencee shall, during construction of the Development, ensure that all fuel storage areas associated with the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from water bodies including wetlands, and ensure that the storage areas comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation.

- 6. The Licencee shall, during and upon completion of construction of the Development, collect and dispose of all waste petroleum products generated by the construction activities in accordance with all applicable regulatory requirements.
- 7. The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to Manitoba Regulation 150/91R respecting Waste Disposal Grounds.

REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke, temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
