THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

## THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: "the Licencee"

for the construction of the Development being the upgrading of a section of Provincial Trunk Highway #20 beginning at the junction with Provincial Trunk Highway #5 and extending a distance of 13.2 km in a northerly direction to the west boundary of the Rural Municipality of Ochre River subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

## SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal Proposed Upgrading of PTH 20 (From PTH 5 to Dauphin Beach), dated October, 1993.
- 2. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, provide a copy of this Licence to all contractors and sub-contractors involved in the Development.
- The Licencee shall retain the existing Henderson Creek crossing to provide lakeshore cottage access.
- 4. The Licencee shall, during construction of the Development, maintain access to the existing boat launch facility located within Rainbow Beach Provincial Park.
- 5. The Licencee shall, during each year of construction for the portion of the Development located between station 24 plus 65 to station 42 plus 00, as shown on Plan No. 6272, Sheets 2 and 3 filed as part of the Environment Act Proposal,
  - a) maintain dust control measures;
  - b) limit construction to day light hours;
  - c) cease construction during July and August between Friday 4:00 P.M. and Monday 6:00 A.M.; and
  - d) cease construction during statutory holidays throughout July and August.
- 6. The Licencee shall, prior to disposing of vegetation debris left from the clearing of the highway right-of-way, reach an agreement with the Regional Environment Officer on the method of disposal.

- 7. The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that any fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development and any heavy equipment repair and maintenance associated with the construction of the Development, are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from waterbodies. The storage and equipment maintenance areas shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation.
- 8. The Licencee shall, during and following completion of construction of the Development, collect and dispose of all waste petroleum products generated by construction activities in accordance with regulatory requirements.
- The Licencee shall, during construction, maintain materials on-site required for spill containment and clean-up of hazardous materials.
- 10. The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all non-hazardous waste and debris from the construction activities at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to MR 150/91 respecting Waste Disposal Grounds.

## REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
