## AN ORDER OF THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION UNDER THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT ACT

RE: THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION and DAUPHIN ALFALFA PRODUCTS LTD., Applicant,

WHEREAS

pursuant to the provisions of The Clean Environment Act, on the 4th day of October, 1972, Dauphin Alfalfa Products Ltd. submitted an application to The Clean Environment Commission to prescribe limits on the emission or deposit of contaminants to the environment from the operation of an alfalfa dehydrating plant located on Lot 3, Plan 2429, in the Town of Dauphin, Manitoba;

AND WHEREAS

the Commission issued Order No. 269 on the 18th day of May, 1973, prescribing limits in connection with the said operation;

AND WHEREAS

on the 21st day of August, 1981, pursuant to Section 14(1) of the said Act, the Applicant filed with the Department of Consumer and Corporate Affairs and Environment a proposal in connection with the alteration of premises to increase production capacity and for the continued operation of the said plant;

AND WHEREAS

in the absence of limits, terms and conditions prescribed by a regulation under the said Act, the proposal was referred to the Commission for the prescribing of limits, terms and conditions in connection with the said operation;

AND WHEREAS

after giving notice of the proposal and of its intention to consider rescinding Order No. 269, the Commission did not receive notice of representation from any person who is likely to be affected by an order of the Commission in connection with this operation;

AND WHEREAS

the Commission considered the operation on the 25th day of January, 1982;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

from any point of emission of the said operation to exceed 0.23 grams per standard cubic metre calculated at 25 degrees Celsius and 760 millimetres of mercury at the point of emission. The Applicant shall not permit the emission of particulate matter

- 2. The Applicant shall not cause or permit visible emissions from any point of emission of the said operation that exhibit an opacity equal to or greater than:
  - (a) 20 percent for a period exceeding 4 minutes in any 1 hour at the point of emission;
  - (b) 40 percent at any time at the point of emission.
- 3. The Applicant shall maintain a high standard of equipment maintenance and good housekeeping in connection with the said plant consistent with meeting the limits, terms and conditions prescribed in this order.
- 4. This order replaces Order No. 269 which shall be is hereby rescinded.
