In order to determine "how to fix it", one has to understand "how it works" and this is where it started for me. This following the 1996 Red River Flood and my examination and linkage to Winnipeg's sewage infrastructure.

I was made aware by a life long Valley resident of "the promise of the Government(s) Engineers" and that the floodway was constructed under an agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government for the Province of Manitoba. Within this agreement is; Section 20 with terms and conditions requiring provision of a Program of Operation for how the flood control works would be operated.

Section 20 required "Federal Approval" for the Program of Operation, as well as approval of revisions to said program. Not knowing who was responsible for the 1962 Ministry of Northern Affairs and National Resources, I started at the top, the PM of Canada. Surely he would be able to sort it out!!!

The following is the record of deception and sheltering of critical records by Canada at Manitoba's request and on their behalf. But for the diligent efforts over some six years by the now retired Manitoba Ombudsman, Mr. Barry Tuckett, we as Canadians would still not be fully informed on Red River flood control matters.

My federal *Access to Information Act* (ATIP) requests started in 1997 with a Privy Council *Access* request that was subsequently transferred to Environment Canada. It was assigned File No. A-97-0158/mc after transferred from PCO and evolved into ATIP A-1998-0046/mc with denied access at Manitoba's request. Only by the Environment Canada June 15, 2005 ATIP release; A-2005-00074/mc was the circle "closed" back to the former PM The Rt. Hon. Jean Chrétien.

With the change of government in 1999 I requested the records under A-2000-0161/mc and again they were denied by the Doer government. I confronted the Premier about "Federal Approval" and "Sheltered Records" on April 11, 2001 during the unnecessary flooding of our Upstream community, with 9 of 11 released subsequently released. -The Story Below.

As a follow up to my request for approval documentation and historic records, made directly to you on the Winnipeg Floodway control structure on Wednesday April 11, 2001, I now provide the same request in writing. Additionally, I provide a relevant record package, and questions to ponder and respond to before you metaphorically button the collar on your flack jacket and continue down the same road as others in this matter.

Before my contention and grievance is dismissed as being caused by the actions of the previous administration, you should note that you and your technocrats are continuing as others. Given heavy and sustained rains in the Valley over the next ten days to two weeks, you and I would be in the same metaphoric boat as in May of 1997.

I noted at your press conference, that the release or access to Federal documentation was being blocked by your government. I provide copy as "Attachment A", an Information Source, Access to Information request form, submitted in the spring of 1998 to Environment Canada. The requested records were located with about 13 pages or portions thereof of 30 year old documents withheld at the request of the Province of Manitoba. In 2000, I again requested the excluded records and again was denied access because of the requested third party exemption. Mr. Doer, I'm requesting that you intervene, and authorize Canada to release these documents.

I have additionally requested the assistance of the Information Commissioner of Canada in complaint against Environment Canada and PFRA Manitoba, for release of all Federal records from the Red River Floodway Operational Review Committee, and it's December 1999 report. The Red River floodway operation review was conducted by a Provincially appointed committee which excluded and disallowed any meaningful participation from interested and elected upstream residents to be affected by any changes to the Program. I remind the Premier that this excluded community is likely the same folks to be courted to support the Winnipeg Floodway expansion option and the necessary surcharging of the floodway and artificial flooding upstream.

#### Dear Commissioner:

The lack of prompt assignment of an investigative officer to my complaint against Environment Canada, and the importance of the issue to our community prompts this letter to your attention.

As background I provide an outline of some of the issues at hand that relate to the Government of Canada, (Canada) and the Government for the Province of Manitoba, (Manitoba) for the Red River flood protection of the City of Winnipeg.

In the 1997 Red River flood large portions of southern Manitoba was flooded by a "Natural" and in the immediate upstream of Greater Winnipeg Floodway, unnatural or man-made flood levels. Upstream of floodway flooding was exacerbated by Province of Manitoba flood control, causing 2.5 to 3.9 feet above "natural levels" in our area in the flood protection for the City of Winnipeg.

The 1997 flood was studied by at least three technical bodies, {Charles Howard and Associates of Victoria, BC (December 18,1997 Report). The Manitoba Water Commission (June, 1998 Report) and The International Joint Commission, Washington/Ottawa (November 2000 Report) with all reporting and commenting on the flooding of one community in the flood protection of another.

The present Red River flood control infrastructure, was conceived by the Government of Canada and the Province of Manitoba, after the 1950 Winnipeg Red River flood. The present infrastructure was constructed following the signing of the May 28, 1962 agreement for the construction and maintenance of the Greater Winnipeg Floodway. This agreement required a "Program of Operation" for the works to be submitted to the Federal Minister for approval and subsequent changes to the "Program", submitted for approval.

The above reference to 1950 or later records prompted my first Federal records search starting in the late spring of 1997, seeking records from the former Ministry of Northern Affairs and National Resources. Because I was unaware which Federal Ministry was responsible, I forwarded my first ATIP request to the Prime Minister of Canada.

This request was for the Federal approval documentation by which the Province of Manitoba was operating the Greater Winnipeg Floodway in the 1997 flood protection of Winnipeg. Environment Canada was found to be the responsible department for the former ministry and after complaint to your office for lack of prompt and complete response, Mr. Conrad Hoff intervened and Environment Canada provided a response. This reply stated that Manitoba had two "Programs of Operation" the 1970 and 1984. Manitoba submitted the 1970 Program to Canada and was not approved, the 1984 program was not submitted for approval.

This reply prompted me to submit a subsequent ATIP request for all Government of Canada records notes and documentation between Canada and Manitoba, EC File No. A-1998-0046/mc. Environment Canada advised of an estimated 80 hours of documentation search and required a 50% up front contribution. The 50% fee was provided and searches conducted. Environment Canada were not in compliance with the 30-day requirement of the Act and the search fee was felt to be excessive. Again I complained and Mr. Hoff and he resolved my complaint.

The 1998 Environment Canada release was documentation from No. 001 to 222 204 with several pages or sections of pages withheld at the request of a third party. In 2000, a follow-up request was made to Environment Canada under the Act, for the 1998 excluded documents and assigned EC File No. A-2000-0161/mc. Again the same records were withheld for the same third party exclusion.

This lack of release by Environment Canada and subsequent complaint acknowledged by your office on November 20, 2000 is the extent of action by the Information Commissioner, thus this letter. The withheld documentation from between 1960 and 1971, relates directly to the intergovernmental discussions on proposed operation of the Winnipeg Floodway control works. These works that are presently capable of flooding the complete inhabited upstream of floodway area, up to 6.5 feet higher than the Red River flood of 1997, without negotiated right to do so.

Our communities right to know, and the public interest in disclosure of thirty year old records must clearly outweigh any invasion of privacy or necessity of nondisclosure of intergovernmental records.

Thank you in advance of your prompt follow-up regarding the above.

I am enclosing one copy of the above Manual as discussed. Please note the following:

- The relationship shown on Figure 2, Reduction in Assimiboine River Peaks at Portage la Prairie with Shellmouth Reservoir in Operation is not used in the operation of the Red River Floodway Inlet Control Structure. Real time data is used in the operation.
- Figure 6, Red River Floodway-Inlet Control Structure Rating Curve is missing from our files. In any event, we do not use this curve to determine the discharge of the Red River Floodway. It is calculated from the relationship:

$$Q = 885 E_1^{1.317} E_2^{0.183}$$

where

Q = discharge in cfs;

- H = water surface elevation at Floodway Inlet minus the control gate elevation, in feet;
- H<sub>2</sub> = water surface elevation at the Floodway Inlet minus the tailwater elevation of the Inlet Control Structure, in feet
- Figure 10: Red River Floodway Inlet Control Structure Gate Elevations. This curve is no longer in use. The attached 000182 Table replaced this figure.

- Our most recent computation sheet, Form 2, replaced Figure 11. A copy is attached.
- Figure 12 is a gauge record sheet but we have rum out of blank forms. An actual example is enclosed.

We have made the point that operating rules are really guidelines. They are not rules in the sense of legal regulations. We have rule curves for all of our reservoirs and control structures, but we use them as guidelines. An engineer would be irresponsible to knowingly allow Winnipeg to flood because he rigidly holds to the operating rules.

This report is in response to your complaint of refused access under *The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FIPPA) against Manitoba Water Stewardship, a public body under the Act.

In an application for access that was received by the Department on February 13, 2004, you made the following request:

On or about April 30, 1997 the Government of Manitoba in two records, corresponded to the Canadian Federal Government about the dire emergency the City of Winnipeg was under given ever-increasing Red River flood stages.

On May 1, 1997 Canada signed an agreement with Manitoba on Red River Valley Disaster Assistance. Please provide these two documents of record maintained as records 197 and 198 of Environment Canada's file on the Red River Floodway. They have been sheltered by the former Water Resources Branch of the Department of Natural Resources (1998), and since April 12, 2001 sheltered by the Executive Council of Manitoba and Premier Doer.

The Department responded to your application by letter dated March 9, 2004, and advised that access was being refused under the following exceptions to disclosure: sections 23(1)(a); 25(1)(n); and, 28(1)(c)(i), and (iii).

Our office received your complaint on March 15, 2004, and enquiries were made with you and the Department. We obtained copies of the records in question and reviewed the withheld information in relation to the cited exceptions. In the course of our

discussions with the Department, we expressed our view that they did not supply information that explained how or why the exceptions to disclosure applied to the withheld information. Our report and recommendation to the department, dated October 13, 2004, a copy of which you received, contained our findings in this matter and our recommendation to the Department. I note that, pursuant to our recommendation, the Department has provided full access to the requested records.
