#### **OVERVIEW:**

Manitoba Conservation and Climate received a Proposal on August 21, 2019 relative to the construction and operation of the Development being a wastewater collection system involving the installation and operation of two 45,000 litre holding tanks and the continuing operation of an existing wastewater collection system, holding tanks, and septic tank and field system at Chesley's Resort located within SE 23-15-4 EPM in the Rural Municipality of St. Andrews. The collected and stored wastewater in the holding tanks at Chesley's Resort will be pumped out and trucked by licensed haulers to the Rural Municipality of St. Andrews wastewater treatment lagoon or an alternative wastewater treatment facility operating under an Environment Act Licence.

A notice of the Environment Act proposal was placed in the Selkirk Record newspaper on Thursday, September 12, 2019. The newspaper notification invited responses until September 25, 2019. Requests for comments on the Proposal were distributed to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) on September 11, 2019. Responses from the TAC were requested by September 25, 2019.

## **PUBLIC HEARING:**

As no requests were received for a public hearing, a public hearing is not recommended.

### **CROWN-INDIGENOUS CONSULTATION:**

The Government of Manitoba recognizes that it has a duty to consult in a meaningful way with Indigenous communities when any proposed provincial law, regulation, decision or action may infringe upon or adversely affect the exercise of the Indigenous rights of that community.

The proposal involves the installation and operation of two new 45,000 litre holding tanks and the continuing operation of existing wastewater collection systems, holding tanks, and septic tank and field system and the decommissioning of a previously existing wastewater pond. Since resource use is not affected by the project, it is concluded that Crown-Indigenous consultation is not required for the project.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Development be licensed under The Environment Act subject to the limits, terms and conditions as described on the attached draft Environment Act Licence.

It is further recommended that the administration of the new Licence be assigned to the Interlake Region of the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch. Responsibility for site inspections during construction and record drawings should be held jointly by the Environmental Approvals and Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch until upgrades of the wastewater management facility associated with this Licence have been completed.
