OVERVIEW:

Manitoba Sustainable Development received a Proposal on May 6, 2016 for the construction and operation of a bulk material handling plant at 50 Nicolas Avenue in Winnipeg, Manitoba. The facility provides aggregate materials for concrete production through volumetric mixers, slingers and trailers to be mixed at job sites during the construction season from May to November.

COMMENTS FROM THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

Manitoba Sustainable Development - Climate Change & Air Quality Branch

Air Quality Section recommended adherence to the Best Environmental Management Practices for Redi-Mix Concrete Plants prepared by the Manitoba Heavy Construction Association during operation and inclusion of noise nuisance clause in the licence.

Disposition

The draft Environment Act Licence Clauses 6 and 10 address issues related to adherence to the Best Environmental Management Practices for Redi-Mix Concrete Plants and noise nuisance, respectively.

<u>Manitoba Sustainable Development – Water Use Licensing Section</u>

The licencee is required to obtain a licence for the water use at the facility.

Disposition

The proponent is informed of the requirement to obtain a water use licence.

PUBLIC HEARING:

A public hearing was not requested and is not recommended.

CROWN-INDIGENOUS CONSULTATION:

The Government of Manitoba recognizes that it has a duty to consult in a meaningful way with Indigenous communities when any proposed provincial law, regulation, decision or action may infringe upon or adversely affect the exercise of the Indigenous rights of that community.

This proposed facility will be located on a private land in the City of Winnipeg zoned for Industrial use. There would be no infringement of Indigenous rights under Section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982 at this time. Therefore, it is concluded that Crown-Indigenous consultation is not required for the project.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Proponent should be issued a Licence for the installation and operation of a bulk materials handling facility operating as SCMS Inc. in accordance with the specifications, terms and conditions of the attached draft Licence. Enforcement of the Licence should be assigned to the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch of Manitoba Sustainable Development.
