Manitoba Sustainable Development received a Proposal on April 20, 2016 for the expansion and continued operation of the Development being a custom truck body and a pneumatic conveying system manufacturing facility at 70 3rd Ave NE in Carman, Manitoba. COMMENTS FROM THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

Manitoba Sustainable Development - Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch

The branch provided the following comments.

- A copy of all hazardous chemicals inventory at a location that can be accessed during an emergency.
- To maintain records of the type and quantity of hazardous waste generated, stored and disposed and should be available to an Environment Officer upon request.
- Emergency spill containment and clean-up equipment should be available in the facility where hazardous chemicals/waste are stored, handled, and/or transferred.
- Pollutant emission should be limited to comply with legislative requirements

Disposition

These comments have been forwarded to the proponent for consideration. In addition clauses 8, 9, 18 to 23, 25 and 26, 29 and 30, 31 and 32, and 36 to 38 of the draft Environment Act Licence address issues related to emission limits, emission monitoring, spill containment, hazardous waste handing and emergency responses.

PUBLIC HEARING:

A public hearing was not requested and is not recommended.

CROWN-INDIGENOUS CONSULTATION:

The Government of Manitoba recognizes that it has a duty to consult in a meaningful way with Indigenous communities when any proposed provincial law, regulation, decision or action may infringe upon or adversely affect the exercise of the Indigenous rights of that community.

The proposed expansion will be to an existing facility located in an industrial zoned area within the Town of Carman. As the operation is not expected to affect Indigenous rights, it is concluded that Crown-Indigenous consultation is not required for the project.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Proponent should be issued a Licence for the expansion and continued operation of a custom truck body and a pneumatic conveying system manufacturing facility in accordance with the specifications, terms and conditions of the attached draft Licence. Enforcement of the Licence should be assigned to the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch of Manitoba Sustainable Development.
