OVERVIEW:

Manitoba Sustainable Development received a proposal on February 10, 2015 for the continued operation of a anhydrous ammonia storage and handling facility located at SE 3-23-2 EPM in the Municipality of Bifrost-Riverton, Manitoba. The development consists of two 60 metric tonnes anhydrous ammonia storage vessels.

<u>Comment</u>: No concerns with this proposal; However at this location, under municipal jurisdiction, an Anhydrous Ammonia Storage /Handling Facility requires a Conditional Use Order from the RM of Bifrost- Riverton via the Eastern Interlake Planning District, to be in compliance with municipal bylaws as detailed below.

The ZBL defines as follows :

Bulk Oil or Chemical Storage Area: means a premises primarily intended for the storage, sale or distribution of synthetic or petroleum based fluids or chemicals; fertilizers; and other potentially obnoxious, explosive, or hazardous materials, chemicals, gases or fluids. The sale or distribution of such materials, chemicals, gases or fluids are primarily intended to be on a wholesale basis to commercial or industrial users, or to customers such as farmers, who normally buy in large volume or in bulk. A bulk oil or chemical storage area is situated, operated, or used only in accordance with all environmental safety standards, laws, and regulations.

ZBL Part IV Section 74.0, General Provisions, has specific yard requirements, which the proposal appears to be in

compliance with:

74.0 Anhydrous Ammonia Facilities

Unless varied by Council pursuant to the Planning Act, anhydrous ammonia facilities shall not be located:

- (1) within 2,640 feet (1/2 mile) of a residential, general development or seasonal recreation zone;
- (2) within 300 feet of a dwelling; or
- (3) within 328 feet (100 metres) of the edge of right-of-way of a highway or road.

The requirements noted above shall be deemed to be yard requirements for the purpose of this section.

An Anhydrous Ammonia Storage /Handling Facility requires a Conditional Use Order as per ZBL Section 31.4 below, in accordance with the provisions of Section 59 of The Planning Act.

The Proponent should be issued a Licence for the construction and operation of a of am anhydrous ammonia storage and handling facility in accordance with the specifications, terms and conditions of the attached draft Licence.

Enforcement of the Licence should be assigned to the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch of Manitoba Sustainable Development.
