

Notice of Environment Act Proposal

Manitoba Sustainable Development has received a proposal pursuant to The Environment Act regarding the following operation and invites public participation in the review process:

**MANITOBA SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT – PARKS AND PROTECTED SPACES
BRANCH – OPAPISKAW CAMPGROUND WATER TREATMENT PLANT
UPGRADES – FILE: 5893.00**

A proposal has been received from Associated Engineering on behalf of the Parks and Protected Spaces Branch of Manitoba Sustainable Development for the construction and operation of an upgraded water treatment plant at the Opapiskaw Campground. The plant would withdraw up to 0.50 liter per second of water from Nutimik Lake between May to September, treat it using a filtration/ion exchange treatment process, disinfect it using ultraviolet and chlorine disinfection, and distribute it within the campground. Backwash water from the treatment process (about 62 cubic metres per year) would be discharged back to Nutimik Lake while the regeneration water (upwards of 30 cubic metres per year) would be directed to the campground's wastewater lagoon. Full operation commenced at the start of 2017.
