OVERVIEW:

Manitoba Sustainable Development received a Proposal on March 31, 2018 for the construction and operation of a bulk material handling facility to be located at Parcel A, Plan 60612 PLTO on N $\frac{1}{2}$ 16-12-8 WPM. The proposed development will retrofit a 24.4 by 48.8 meter existing seed storage building into an agrichemical warehouse. The warehouse will house a maximum of 45 pallets of herbicides, fungicides and insecticides.

The attached proposal does not provide the pre and post development discharge rates. From the sketch plan, it is not clear if the runoff from the subject property goes to PTH 16 ditches or it remain within the municipal drainage system.

Please have the applicant provide the following:

- · Runoff flow pattern of the overall area including the municipal and highway ditches
- Pre development discharge pattern and rates
- Post development discharge pattern and rates including the size of the proposed control culverts

PUBLIC HEARING:

CROWN-INDIGENOUS CONSULTATION:

The Government of Manitoba recognizes that it has a duty to consult in a meaningful way with Indigenous communities when any proposed provincial law, regulation, decision or action may infringe upon or adversely affect the exercise of the Indigenous rights of that community.

This proposed facility will be located on an existing agricultural property. There would be no infringement of Indigenous rights under Section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982. Therefore, it is concluded that Crown-Indigenous consultation is not required for the project.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Proponent should be issued a Licence for the construction and operation of a bulk material storage and handling facility in accordance with the specifications, terms and conditions of the attached draft Licence. Enforcement of the Licence should be assigned to the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch of Manitoba Sustainable Development.
