Dear Alex J. Nisbet:

In May 2019, Manitoba Infrastructure's Environment Act Proposal for the Lake Manitoba and Lake St. Martin Outlet Channels project, including an environmental assessment scoping document was posted on the Public Registry. The proposal was reviewed by the public at that time. In March 2020, Manitoba Infrastructure filed an Environmental Impact Statement followed by a public comment period ending on May 25, 2020. You provided comments identifying concerns with the project during these public comment periods.

Pursuant to section 12(6) of The Environment Act, I have decided not to ask the Clean Environment Commission to hold a public hearing for the project. My decision is based on the fact that there has been substantial opportunity for public comment. As part of my licensing responsibilities my department has overseen an extensive public and technical review process. In addition to the two opportunities above, the proponent conducted public consultation. An extensive Crown-Indigenous consultation process is also underway with Indigenous communities and the results of this process once completed will also be available to inform my eventual licensing decision. All of the above will collectively serve to fully inform my licensing decision. I am satisfied that an additional public hearing by the Clean Environment Commission is not required for me to make a licensing decision under section 12(7) of The Act.

Under section 28(1) of The Environment Act, you may file an appeal of my decision concerning a public hearing. If you wish to file an appeal, it must be done to my attention in writing within 30 days after the date of the decision and set out the reasons for the appeal.
