OVERVIEW:

Manitoba Sustainable Development received a Proposal on April 17, 2018 for the relocation and operation of a hazardous and medical waste collection depot to 20 Ronn Road, Stony Mountain, MB in the in the Rural Municipality of Rosser, Manitoba. The facility will accept medical wastes, and a variety of hazardous wastes; store them temporarily and then have the materials transported to a licensed facility for processing or disposal.

The Department, on May 12, 2018, placed a copy of the Proposal in the Public Registry online at <http://www.gov.mb.ca/sd/eal/registries>. An electronic link to the Proposal was also provided to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) members. A notice of The Dangerous Goods Handling and Transportation Act proposal was also placed in the Winnipeg Free Press. The newspaper and TAC notifications invited responses until June 12, 2018.

COMMENTS FROM THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

Manitoba Sustainable Development – Environmental Compliance and Enforcement

ECE requested additional information regarding wastewater (sanitary and surface).

Disposition:

Information received from proponent about wastewater management. Clauses included in draft licence to deal with sanitary wastewater and water collected in catch basins or floor drains.

Manitoba Growth, Enterprise and Trade – Office of Fire Commissioner

OFC recommends obtaining building and occupancy permits and complying with the Manitoba Fire Code and an emergency plan should be submitted to local Fire Department.

Disposition:

Information passed on to proponent.

PUBLIC HEARING:

A public hearing is not recommended for this Development.

CROWN-INDIGENOUS CONSULTATION:

The Government of Manitoba recognizes that it has a duty to consult in a meaningful way with Indigenous communities when any proposed provincial law, regulation, decision or action may infringe upon or adversely affect the exercise of the Indigenous rights of that community.

This proposed facility will be located within an established industrial park just off a major transportation route (route 90). There would be no infringement of Indigenous rights under Section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982. Therefore, it is concluded that Crown-Indigenous consultation is not required for the project.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Proponent should be issued a Licence for the operation of the Stericycle Transfer Facility in accordance with the specifications, terms and conditions of the attached draft Licence. Enforcement of the Licence should be assigned to the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Branch of Manitoba Sustainable Development.

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
