Transfer Station Operating Permit

In accordance with the Waste Management Facilities Regulation, made under The Environment Act, **Manitoba Conservation and Climate, Parks and Protected Spaces** are hereby permitted to operate a **Transfer Station** to be known as the **South Duck Transfer Station** situated at **NW 7-30-25 WPM** in the Duck Mountain Provincial Park, Province of Manitoba.

THIS OPERATING PERMIT is subject to being AMENDED, SUSPENDED or REVOKED under section 7 of the Waste Management Facilities Regulation.

THIS OPERATING PERMIT is issued subject to the following TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

General Terms and Operating Conditions

1. This permit expires on March 31, 2025.
2. The Operator shall maintain and operate the South Duck Transfer Station (the Facility) in accordance with the most current version of the Waste Management Facilities Regulation (M.R. 37/2016) and this Operating Permit.
3. The Operator shall develop an Operations Manual detailing the operation and maintenance for this Facility in accordance with M.R. 37/2016. This manual should include but not be limited to a detailed list of waste and recyclable materials accepted, fish waste handling and management practices, emergency and safety procedures, location where materials not accepted are diverted to and maintenance and closure activities. The Operator shall provide the Manual to an Environment Officer upon request.
4. The Operator shall maintain a copy of the Operations Manual developed pursuant to M.R. 37/2016 and a copy of this Operating Permit at the Facility or where the Facility is managed.
5. The Operator shall obtain approval in writing from the Director for any proposed alterations to the Facility before proceeding with the alteration.

Site Access and Control

6. The Operator shall restrict access to the Facility when site supervision is not provided, with a locked gate, barrier or other system approved in writing by an Environment Officer.

Materials Acceptance and Handling

7. Unless otherwise approved in writing by an Environment Officer, the Operator shall allow only solid waste from the Childs Lake Provincial Campground, Childs Lake Cottage Subdivision, Blue Lake Provincial Campground, Blue Lake Cottage Subdivision, Singush Lake Provincial Campground and Singush Lake Cottage Subdivision to be deposited at the Facility.
8. Materials collected for recycling or reuse must be segregated and temporarily stockpiled in clearly signed designated areas. These areas must be maintained to control weeds, vectors and quality of the materials. The Operator shall have the materials removed regularly or upon the request of an Environment Officer, within the timeframe specified.
9. The Operator shall remove any litter accumulated along the access road and around the perimeter of the site. Litter collection shall occur at minimum twice annually or as required by an Environment Officer.
10. The Operator shall not bury or permanently dispose of any materials at the transfer station without written authorization from the Environment Officer, notwithstanding the Fish Waste managed in accordance with clauses 17 through 20.
11. The household waste deposited at the Facility shall be removed at minimum every thirty (30) days or at a frequency required by an Environment Officer.
12. The Operator shall implement control measures to prevent attraction and sustenance of rodents and scavenging vectors.
13. The Operator shall not accept any livestock or other animal mortalities at the Facility.

Hazardous Wastes

14. The Operator shall collect and dispose of hazardous waste in accordance with The Dangerous Goods Handling and Transportation Act, other Provincial and Federal Regulations.

Surface Water Management

15. The site shall be constructed such that all uncontaminated surface water flows to the perimeter ditch and impacted water from all material storage areas shall be contained within the Facility boundaries.

Burning of Specified Waste

16. The Operator shall not allow burning at this Facility.

Fish and Ash Waste Pit

17. The Operator shall only accept fish and ash waste from the sites identified in Clause 7.

18. The Operator shall limit the excavation of the waste pit to 1 metre depth and no larger than 3 metres in diameter.
19. The Operator shall clearly mark the edges of the pit and post signs indicating that only fish and ash waste may be deposited in the pits (i.e. no plastics, metals or other materials) and a warning of the potential for harm if entering the pit due to the inconsistent materials present in the pits (i.e. drowning, submersion hazard).
20. The Operator shall close, maintain, upgrade, or establish a new Fish and Ash Waste Pit at the request of an Environment Officer in the timeframe specified by the request.

Revocation

21. This Permit replaces Permit No. 41060 which is hereby rescinded.
