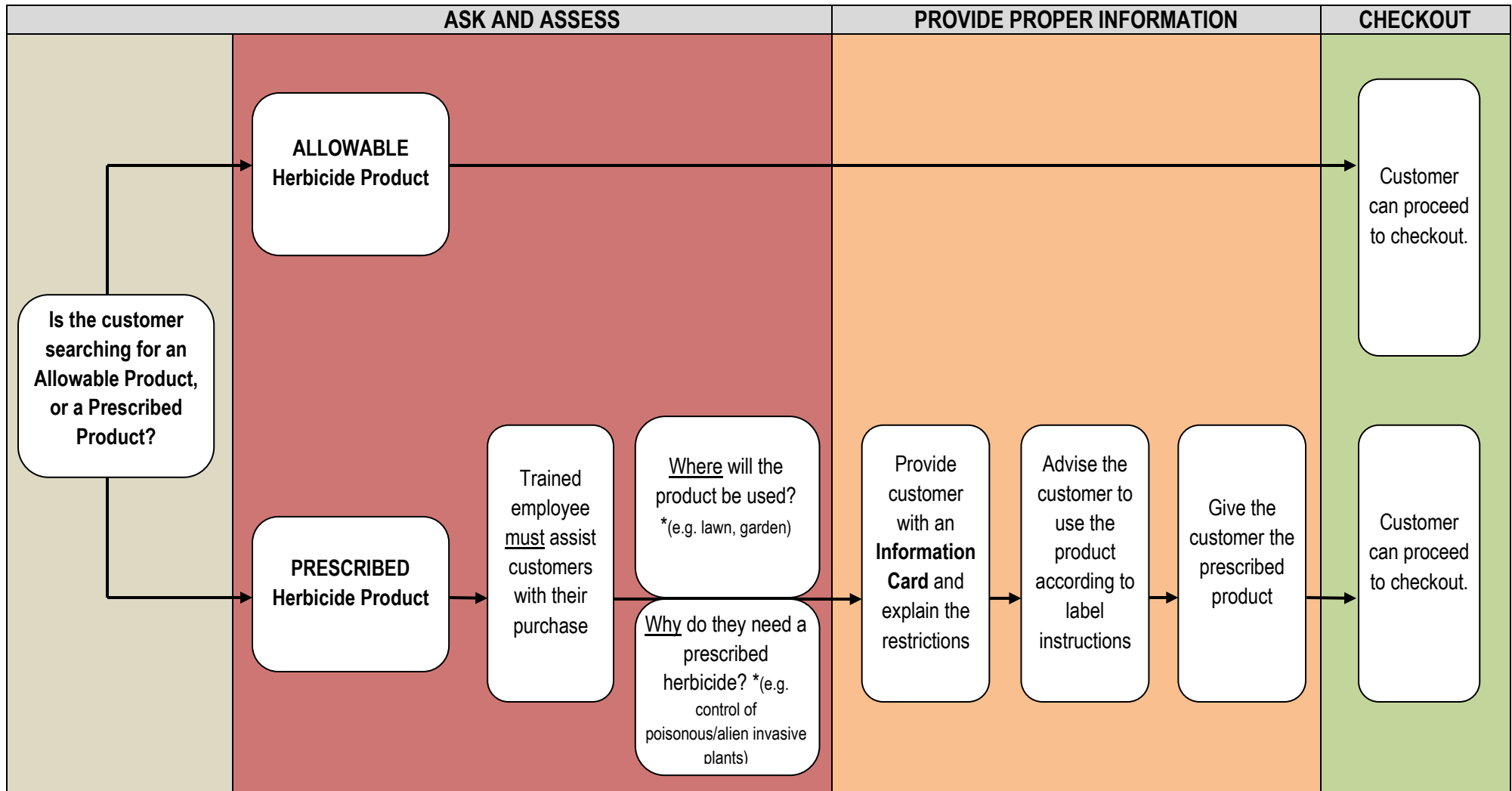


Herbicide sales process for Sales Associates according to the *Non-Essential Pesticide Use Regulation (MR 286/2014)***



*The following exempted uses are allowed on lawns**, exterior property of a school, hospital, or child care centres:

1. Destroy/control poisonous plants (e.g. Poison Ivy)
2. Destroy/control alien invasive plant species (e.g. Red Bartsia)
3. Uses in areas not defined as a lawn*** (e.g. fruit, vegetable, flower gardens as well as shrubs and trees)

**This regulation does not apply to a person who holds a valid pesticide dealer licence issued under *The Pesticides and Fertilizer Control Act*.

***A lawn is defined as a plot of grass which is regularly mowed at a uniform height including any associated walkway, driveway or patio.

List of active ingredients of allowable herbicides available at retail outlets in Manitoba include:

- acetic acid (non-selective weed control)
- ammonium soaps of fatty acids
- citric acid
- corn gluten meal (pre-emergent weed control product and alternate to weed and feed products)
- fatty acid
- iron (ferrous or ferric) sulfate
- iron, if present as FeHEDTA (selective, broadleaf weed killer)
- lactic acid
- liquid corn gluten
- soap (potassium salts of fatty acid)
- sodium chloride (selective weed killer)
