

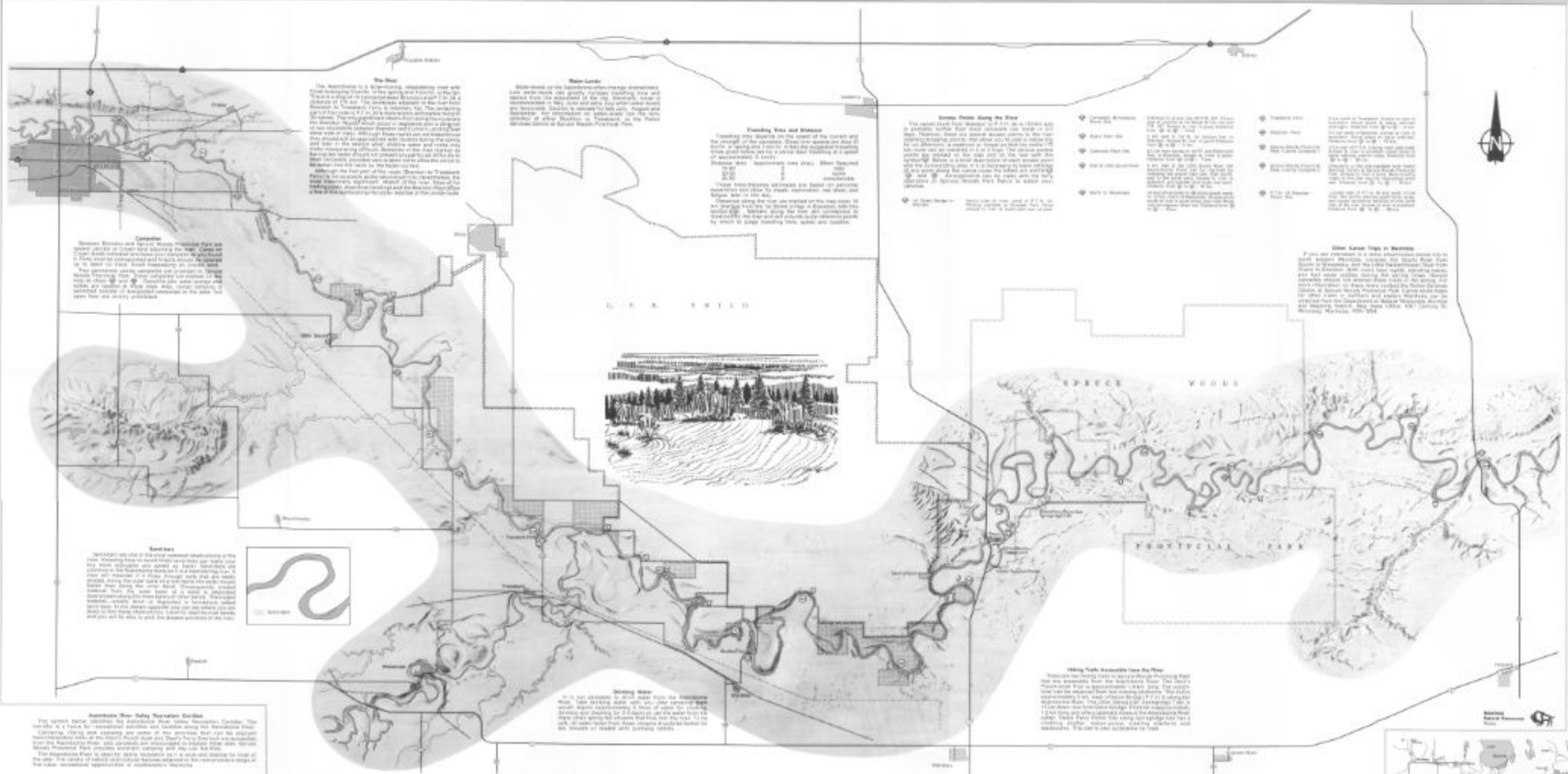
ASSINIBOINE RIVER CANOE ROUTE
