

Barbeques on Manitoba Provincial Parks Beaches

Barbeque Information for Beach Visitors

Before firing up a barbeque grill during a beach visit, it's important to follow these guidelines to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience.

At beaches, barbeques (BBQ) or fires of any kind are NOT allowed on the sand.

CSA-approved portable BBQs (grill, stove, or other suitable container) or park firepits can be used at green spaces. Propane and solid fuel (like charcoal) are allowed.

NOTE - during high fire danger periods (like fire bans or high winds), solid fuel appliances are prohibited.

Fire Safety:

- Raise the BBQ off the ground, keeping it away from dry grass, trees, and flammable materials, including picnic tables and benches. Users will be held responsible for park damage.
- Set up BBQs to direct smoke away or reduce its impact on people, ensuring everyone's comfort.
- Have water, sand, or a fire extinguisher nearby for emergencies.
- Always supervise a lit BBQ.

When Leaving Your Site:

- Hot charcoals must be fully extinguished and cooled before safe disposal. Dispose hot charcoal in charcoal bins, if available. Do not dispose of hot charcoals in garbage cans, natural environment, or bury in the sand.
- Clean site of all food, garbage or other attractants.
