## Campground Tips

- Prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Always “Clean, Drain, Dry, Dispose and Decontaminate IF”. Visit [Manitoba.ca/StopAIS](http://Manitoba.ca/StopAIS).
- Only build fires in a designated firepit or use a camp stove. Before leaving make sure your fire is completely out.
- Please! Do not litter.
- Be sensitive to wildlife. Bears can be dangerous and should not be fed. Food must be stored away from your campsite, preferably in a locked vehicle, to avoid attracting hungry animals. Do not store food in your tent.
- The use of insect repellent will add to your comfort.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Campground Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.
- Canoeists and hikers travelling in backcountry areas should advise a friend of their intended destination and anticipated length of trip.
- It is illegal to use or transport elm firewood.
- Moving firewood can spread harmful invasive species and destroy our forests. Protect Manitoba’s trees. Don’t move firewood.

**W**illiam Lake Campground offers 43 basic campsites and two small group use areas. The campground is equipped with all the amenities you’ll need for your outdoor adventure, including a water supply, firewood, modern washrooms, showers, picnic area, picnic shelters and a fish cleaning area. A playground, volleyball court, and horseshoe pitch add to the day’s fun. William Lake has a swimming and beach area. Three boat docks are located around William Lake. Electric motors only are allowed on the lake.

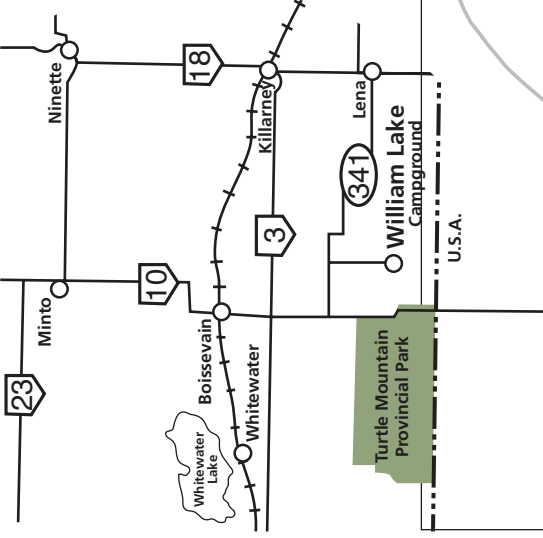
Explore Turtle’s Back Trail on your way to Turtle’s Back Summit and a spectacular view of southwestern Manitoba including the International Peace Garden. This trail passes through Turtle Mountain Community Pasture where local livestock roam and graze. Steep elevation near the summit makes this trail a challenging yet rewarding hike.

William Lake Campground is located east of Highway # 10 and south of Highway #3.

More information on William Lake Campground and William Lake Provincial Park is available on request from the park office.

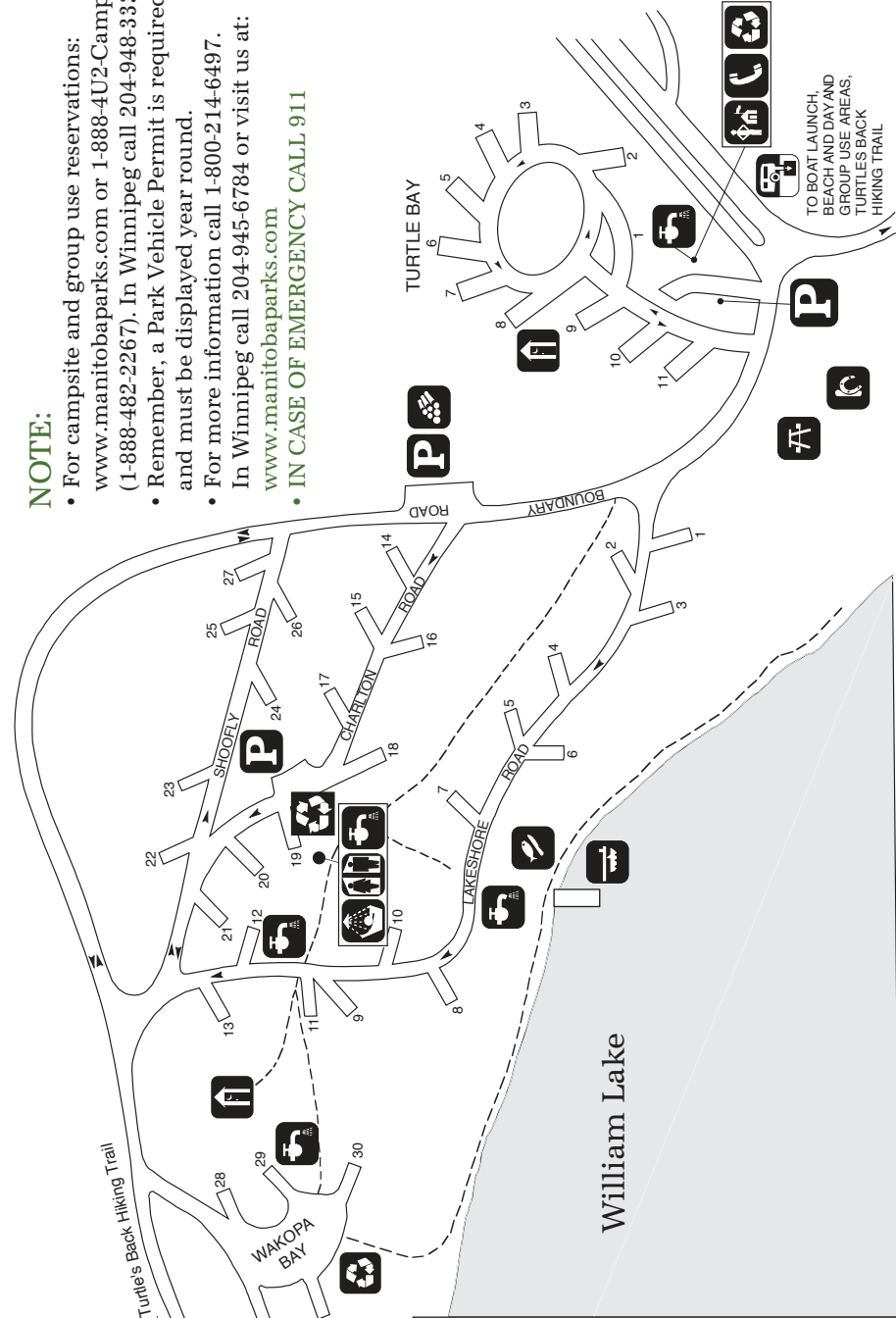
