Manitoba Infrastructure Hydrometric Network

 Manitoba Transportation and Infrastructure owns, operates and maintains a network of approximately 150 water level monitoring stations across the province. About half of these stations are maintained and operated to the standards of the National Hydrometric Program and the data from these stations is published to the <u>National Water Data</u> Archive (HYDAT).
