2. PROGRAM STANDARDS

2.1 Technical Training Review

Closed.

The Steamfitter Provincial Advisory Committee (PAC), and the Red River College instructor, assisted by Branch staff, collectively reviewed and updated the level chart and Steamfitter-Pipefitter units of instruction in accordance with the Canadian Council of Directors of Apprenticeship (CCDA) harmonization initiative. The PAC was informed that the standardized trade health and safety unit was updated in 2018, which includes the 2015 WHIMIS training standards.

The PAC reached consensus to post the proposed technical training for industry consultation.

2.2 Regulation Review**Closed.**

The PAC reviewed 2018 Red Seal Occupational Standards (RSOS) and the current regulation. The PAC:

- Made small administrative revisions to the regulation.
- Revised a portion of section one 'Definitions' to reflect that only certified Steamfitter-Pipefitters and registered Steamfitter-Pipefitter apprentices could install piping equipment, tubing, fittings, supports and accessories used for processes in any installations, including the residential sector.
- Determined that the wages should increase to be consistent with other related trades.
- Recommended that the proposed wages be increased.
 - Level one – 50%;
 - Level two – 60%;
 - Level three – 70%;
 - Level four 80%; and
 - Level five – 90%
- Recommended that section eight be 'repealed' and section nine be removed, as the sections were no longer relevant.
- Recommended that a new section 'Coming into force' be included to allow industry 90 days to adjust to the proposed regulation once registered.

The PAC reached agreement to circulate the proposed regulation for industry consultation.
